In spite of persistent efforts taken by the government, malnutrition continues to persist and plague the Indian population. This scenario is partly due to the complex nature of malnutrition with various contributory causes. The complexity arises from various causes like food intake, environment, health and gender bias. Any approach to address the problem of malnutrition should be multi pronged.

Such concerned effort would go a long way in realising the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goal of Zero Hunger by 2030. This seminar attempts to address this issue.

- Nutrition specific programmes addressing immediate determinants of nutrition (e.g. maternal and child health management and micronutrient supplementation)
- Nutrition sensitive programmes (e.g. agricultural interventions with a nutrition lens)

- Women in agriculture and nutrition
- Nutrition awareness

### **Objectives of the Seminar**


