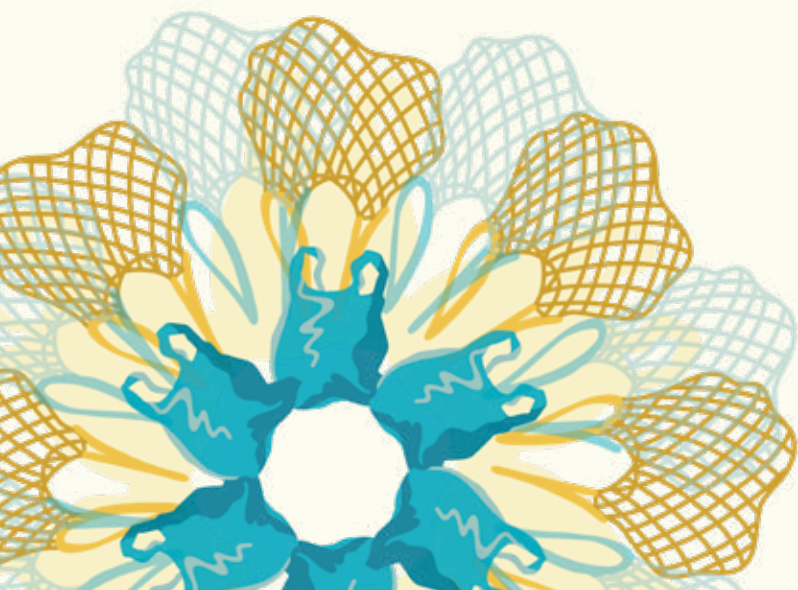

ABOUT THE College

Stella Maris College, a Catholic minority institution of higher education for women, is an autonomous institution affiliated to the University of Madras and is partly residential. It is managed by the Society of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary, a Catholic religious congregation founded by Blessed Mary of the Passion (Hélène de Chappotin) in Ootacamund, Tamil Nadu, in 1877. Guided by her charisma, the initiatives of the College arise from a sound philosophy of life based on faith in God and the contemporary reality of a pluralistic Indian society that is challenged by global ideologies and cultures.

The College was founded on 15 August 1947 in a small one-storeyed building with 32 students in Santhome, Mylapore, Chennai. In 1960, it moved to its present campus "The Cloisters" on Cathedral Road in the heart of the city.

Today, the College has an enrolment of more than 5,500 students from diverse backgrounds, communities and nations.

The College is committed to serving the economically and socially marginalised sections of society. It provides university education in a Christian atmosphere

for deserving students, especially those belonging to the Catholic community. Admission is open to all, irrespective of caste and creed, and all students' rights of conscience are respected.

The College became autonomous in 1987 and has currently 23 undergraduate and 14 postgraduate programmes with five departments offering M.Phil. programmes and seven departments offering Ph.D. programmes. Postgraduate Diplomas and Certificate Courses are also offered.

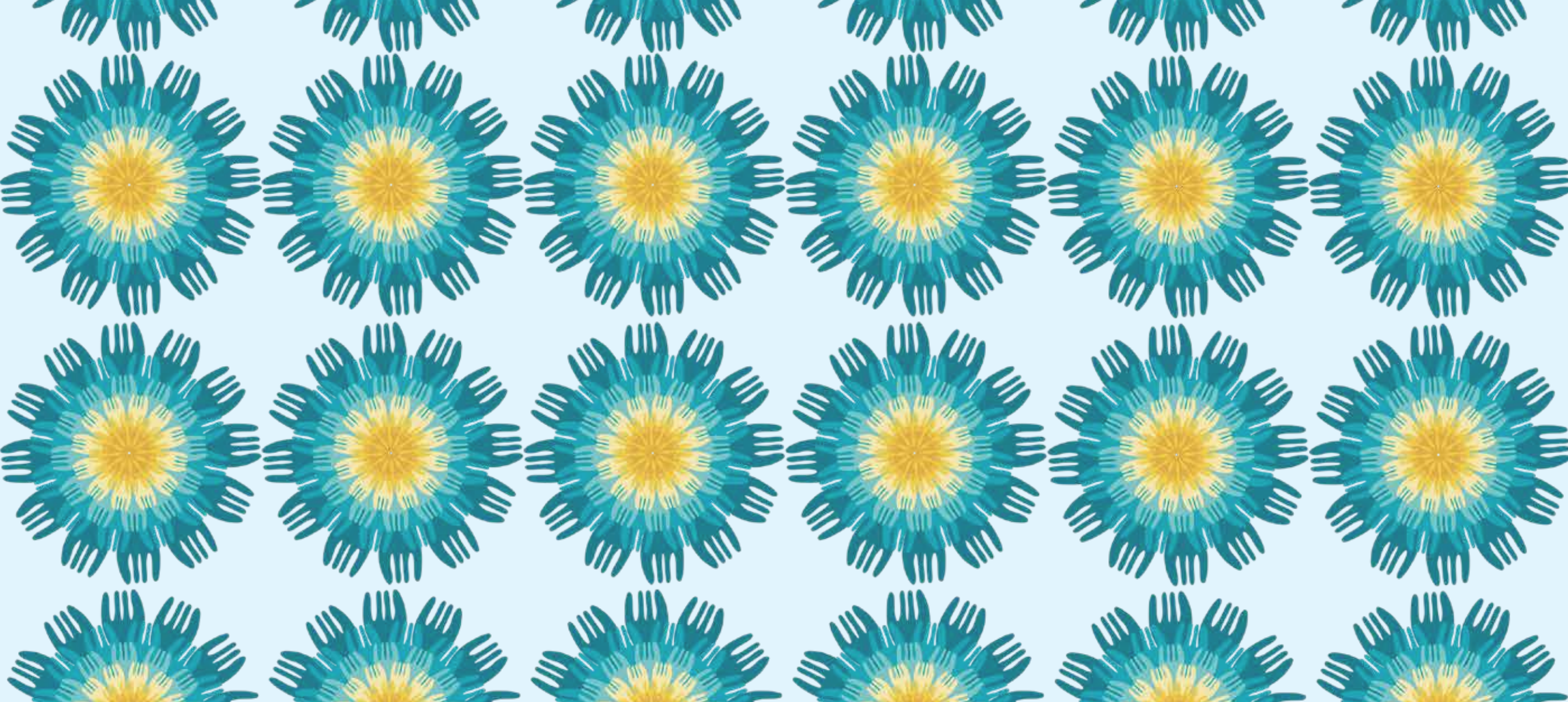

Department of Bioinformatics

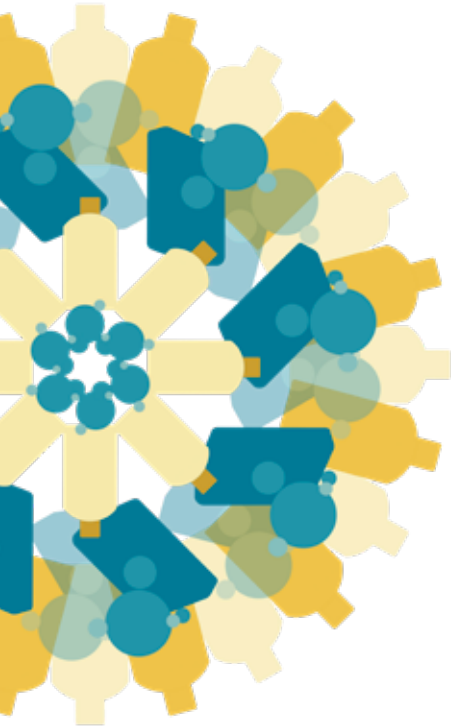
The Department of Bioinformatics organised an international seminar on 'Translational Bioinformatics' on 18 October 2022.

The Department of FPQC commemorated the International Year of Millets 2023 (IYoM). In collaboration with SCEED and the Department of Botany, an exhibition on the millet kingdom was organised. Various millet products, their nutritional and therapeutic value, and a demonstration of recipes were part of the exhibition.

Department of Sustainable Energy Management

A National Conference on Strategies to Promote a Sustainable Biosphere was held on February 2022.

Department of Value Education

Webinars were conducted – for Catholic Faculty on Spirituality of the Covenant; and for all Faculty, on Teaching by Rev. Fr. Joe Mannath. Special talks on Blessed Mary of the Passion and St. Francis of Assisi were organised for the first year Students.

The Star of the Sea Group was very active on campus, assisting in several programmes on campus.

Library

A one-day Regional Seminar 'The Landscape of Academic Libraries in the Digital Era' was organised on 8 October 2022 in which 81 library professionals from all over Tamil Nadu participated.

IQAC

The IQAC conducted a Faculty Development Programme, 'Outcome Based Learning and Course Mapping' facilitated by a team from Holy Cross College, Trichy.

An International Conference 'Leading Together' was held in collaboration with the University of Melbourne, Australia, and the Centre for Women's Studies.

A workshop titled 'Future Ready: Outcome-Based Performance Appraisal' for the IQAC Student Wing was also conducted.

CRIST

A two-day Intercollegiate Regional Workshop on Instrumental Methods was organised by the Department of Chemistry in collaboration with the Centre for Research in Science and Technology (CRIST) from 12 to 13 September 2022

Centre for Women's Studies

An International Symposium in collaboration with Soroptimist International and Gender Centre, Stella Maris College, Rule of Law and Gender Disparity, was held on 13 December 2022.

Gender Centre

Workshops were conducted on gender and sexuality, and expressive art therapy. A workshop on gender-based violence was organised in collaboration with the International Foundation for Crime Prevention and Victim Care on 27 September 2022.

Stella Maris Sustainable Development Students Hub

On 12 August 2022, Stella Maris College collaborated with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Students' Programme to host the International Youth Day Programme to enlighten students on pressing global concerns and ignite change-makers across the state of Tamil Nadu. Three wings—Education, Solutions Lab, and Community—have been established to carry out the operations of the Hub.

The Hub successfully completed Project C, Mental Health Week, and the Know Your SDGs series. The TN SDG Girls Championship 2022, a state-wide initiative, and the Climate Change Outreach Programme are currently underway.

SMCDRIVE

The Skills Development Centre at SMCDRIVE has trained participants in Employability and Livelihood skills in collaboration with the Bank of New York Mellon and the International Association for Human Values. The project has been extended for three more years.

From April 2022, Financial Literacy Training has been given to 546 participants from various communities such as the Kasimode fishing community, SS Puram, and Stella Maris support staff.



A job fair exclusively for women was organised for college students. 1148 women candidates and 60 recruiters participated.

A Media Workshop for Trans-women was organised from 12 to 14 September 2022. Fifteen trans-women were trained in folk arts, drama, and theatre arts.

From 10-14 November 2022, a Digital Literacy programme was conducted at Stella Maris College Extension Project Centre at Thirupachur, for 115 participants and for 33 women living with HIV infection from the Positive Women Network.

A three-month certificate course in Sign Language has been initiated for final year students.

Research Centre

Stella Maris College, in partnership with Trinity Western University conducted the 'Innovation Series', a bi-weekly webinar series which views the ways in which we study, work, and think through innovation after the global lockdown.

'Research Matters', a lecture series that aims to foster a spirit of enquiry and enhance the research performance

of the faculty included a talk on Interpretivism as a Key to Qualitative Social Science, Economics, and Business Research by Rev. Dr. Tony Bradley, Director of the Social and Economic Action Research Centre (SEARCH) Liverpool Hope University Business School, UK.

TWU-SMC 7th Annual Leadership International Conference was held on the topic, 'Innovating Sustainable Leadership: Healthcare, Social Welfare, Climate Change and Hybrid Education'.

SCEED

Faculty Development Programmes were organised for creating online content and self-development. Student Training Workshops were conducted on 'Overcoming Challenges, Report Writing for Project Work', and 'Eco-consciousness'. In collaboration with the organisation, Earth Recycler, SCEED facilitated the installation of a PET Bottle Recycler on campus.

Social Awareness and Service Learning

Social Awareness Programmes are an avenue for our students to experience social realities firsthand and become aware of the differences in social strata, which impact the lives of the common people, while Service Learning gives students an opportunity to reinforce their classroom learning through service to the community. It forms a part of our Extension Activities and involves several local communities.

NCC

Our cadets have demonstrated exceptional skills and abilities in various competitions while participating in various training camps held across various regions and states at the national and state levels. I will mention a few of the outstanding cadets:

Cadet Under Officer Ratuja Bakshi from III B.A. Sociology participated in the 31st All India G.V. Mavalankar Shooting Competition held at Asansol, West Bengal, in October 2022, and has won two gold medals in the Junior and in the Senior Categories.

Petty Officer Cadet Pulluru Toshita Reddy from III BVA was part of the Senior Wing Contingent that marched at the Kartavya Path, Delhi on Republic Day this year, 26 January 2023.

Corporal Gopika Prasad from II BA Economics participated in the Republic Day Camp 2023 at Delhi. She was part of the Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and Andaman and Nicobar Directorate cultural team that secured the first place in Group Dance, first place in Ballet, and third place in the National Integration Awareness Programme. The Directorate won the overall winner's trophy in the RDC cultural event.

Air Wing Cadets Princy W. of third BCA and Manjushree of second B.Sc. Physics attended the All India Vayu Sainik Camp at Jodhpur during September-October 2022 and have won a silver medal in



Line Area and a Gold Medal in Aero-modelling competitions respectively.

Naval Cadets Disha Eshwar from third B.Sc. Psychology and Ranjani from second B.Sc. Psychology, participated in the All-India Yachting Regatta in Odisha in November 2022 representing the Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, and Andaman, and Nicobar directorates and were the overall winners of the competition. Naval Cadets Dharshini from II B. Com General and Pramodita from II B.A. English, participated in the All India Nau Sainik Camp at Visakhapatnam from 2- 12 October 2022. Naval Cadet Pramodita won the gold medal in Health and Hygiene competition.

NSS

The NSS unit of the College has diligently rendered yeoman service to communities in and around Chennai for more than half a century. Some of the major activities of the NSS whose motto is "Not Me but You"

include participation in the National Integration Camp, the NSS Republic Day Parade Camp, participation in Youth Festivals, and volunteering. The YRC focuses on social and health awareness programmes and members receive First-Aid training amongst other leadership and personality development programmes. The members of the Red Ribbon Club conduct AIDS/HIV awareness camps and receive training to become peer educators of social change.

Post pandemic, the three units have raised their levels of involvement in service to community, participation in community-based services, training and awareness programmes, clean-up programmes, walkathons, and various camps among a plethora of other activities in and outside the campus.

A few highlights of the awareness programmes this year include an Organ Donation Awareness Programme in collaboration with the Transplant

Authority of Tamil Nadu; and participation in the Clean-up Awareness 6k Run organised by the Ministry of Fisheries, India, and the Department of Fisheries, Tamil Nadu, to create awareness on the importance of Clean Sea and Coastal Clean-up. Health and disease awareness programmes on Cancer and HIV were also held, with doctors as resource persons.

Two Blood Donation Camps were organised by the units in collaboration with the Madras Blood Bureau and Royapettah Government Hospital on 25 August 2022 and 15 February 2023.

Sports

Our athletes performed well and with the spirit of sportsmanship.

M. Snekaa of I B.Com. CS won first place in Recurve at the Second Tamil Nadu State Level Traditional Archery Championship held at Mettur, Salem in November 2022, and at the First National Level Traditional Archery Championship 2022 held at Mettur, Salem in December 2022, as well as at the National Level Sports Championship 2022 held at Haryana from 20 November to 1 December 2022.

In table tennis, our College team won the Winners title at the University of Madras B-Zone Intercollegiate Tournament held in September 2022 at SCP Jain College and were Runners-Up at the Inter-zone Tournament. At the



IIT Sports Fest 2022 held in September 2022, our College team was the winner.

K.E. Shruthika of B.Com. Shift I won the Winners Title at the Inter-District Table Tennis Championship held in July 2022 at Krishan Kovil.

In badminton, M. Nisha of I B.Com was selected to represent Madras University for the South Zone Inter University tournament held at Jain University Bengaluru in November.

R. Durga of III B.Sc. Physics won First place at the Tamil Nadu State Open Chess Tournament 2023 held in January 2023 at Pudur, Chennai.

In squash, Mithali of III BBA represented the University of Madras and the team won a gold medal at the All India Inter University Squash Championship held at Somaiya Vidya University, Mumbai, in February 2023.

Natalia Orinda Johnson, I B.A. English won a gold medal in Quartet at the Tamil Nadu State Roller Skating Championship held in November in Chennai. She also won the Gold medal in Quartet, Silver in Couple dance and a Bronze medal in Solo dance at the 60th National Roller-Skating Championship held in December at Bengaluru.

In hockey, nine Students of our College were selected to represent the University of Madras Interzone. The players are G. Harini, III B.Sc. Psychology; Himanshi Singh, III B.Com; Shanmugapriya S., II B.Com.; Varshini S., II B.Com; Ashwini K., II B.Com; Vinnarasi, I B.A. Economics; S. Vigneshwari, II B.Com.; M. Harini III B.Sc Zoology and Saranya G. I B.Com.

S. Vigneshwari was selected to represent the University of Madras at the South Zone Hockey Championship held in December at Chennai, and the All-India Inter-University Hockey Tournament held in January 2023 at Punjabi University, Patiala.

At the State Level Taekwondo Championship held at Sri Shanmugha College of Engineering & Technology in November 2022, G. Sandhiya, of II. M.Com. won the Gold medal in the under-49 Category. In the same tournament, P. Anushya, III B.A. History won the Gold



medal in the under 57 kg category and Sharon Ankitha M.S. of II B.Com. CS won the Gold medal in the under 46 kg category.

This year, 25 of our students were selected to represent the Madras University B. Zone, and five students were selected to represent the Madras University. The number of National Level representatives was six.

Our performance in athletics has also been creditable. At the seventh Chevalier Dr. N.R. Dhanapalan Intercollegiate Athletic Meet 2023, S. Kalaivani of I B.Com won a Gold medal in 800 m and a Bronze in 1500 m. Our College relay team won Gold medals in 4 x 100 metres and 4 x 400 metres relay at the same tournament.

The Standards Club

Stella Maris College has partnered with the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) through the setting up of the Standards Club. The Standards Club, an initiative of the BIS is a step towards amassing the power of youth towards spreading awareness on the importance of quality standards. The Standards club of Stella Maris College was inaugurated on the 10 August 2022 in the presence of BIS officials, faculty, and students. A seminar on 'Ensuring Quality through Standards-the BIS Way' was conducted.



Incubation Centre

Four incubation projects, aimed at encouraging technology-based start-ups have been taken up by the Vocational Departments of Food Processing and Quality Control and the Department of Sustainable Energy Management (one each) and the Department of Chemistry (two) in the areas of commercialisation of distilled water that comes from complete renewable sources of energy, cost-effective refrigeration, organic cosmetics, and water purification industries. Students will be mentored by faculty and industry practitioners and have received seed funding from the College.

AASMC

The Alumnae Association of Stella Maris College brought out a souvenir 'Celebrating My Alma Mater'. 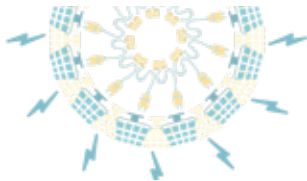

I thank our Chief Guest Dr. Madhavan Mukund for consenting to be here this evening and delivering the College Day address and distributing the prizes.

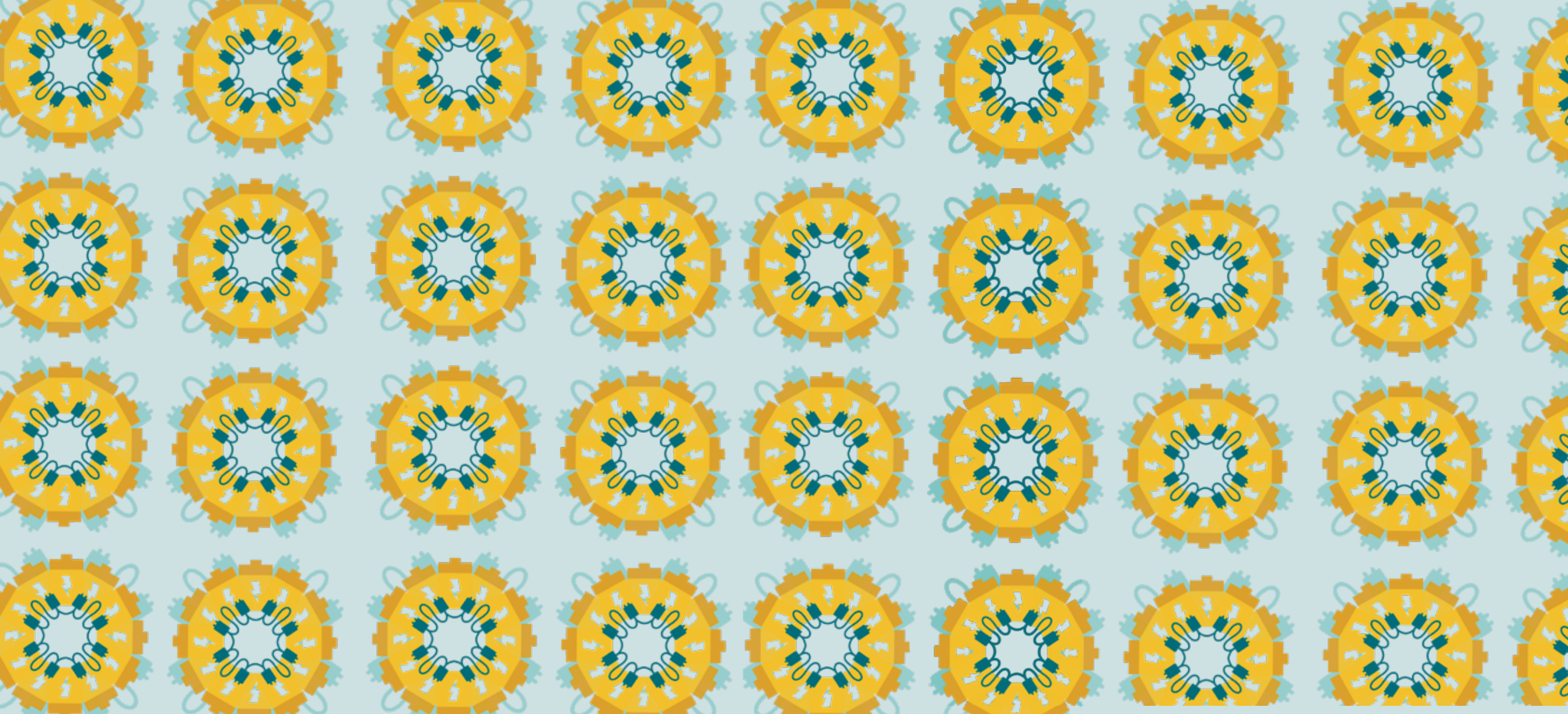

Dr. Sr. Rosy Joseph, Associate Professor, Department of Mathematics, assumed office as the ninth Principal of Stella Maris College (Autonomous) on 18 June 2018. She holds a doctorate in Mathematics from Himachal Pradesh University, India. She has served the College in key posts, such as that of Dean of Academic Affairs, Dean of Student Affairs, and Controller of Examinations.

The College, under her leadership, has grown and progressed, witnessing an unprecedented growth in



student numbers, with a host of new programmes, interdisciplinary courses, online course offerings, extension, and extracurricular activities creating numerous avenues for students to obtain a holistic education for a fulfilling and rewarding future at the workplace and as women of substance in their communities.

She has initiated eleven new programmes in the College—five at the undergraduate level (B.A. English and Communication Skills, B.Voc. Tourism and Hospitality, B.Voc. Banking and Financial Services and Insurance, B.Com. (Honours), B.Com. Banking, Finance, and Entrepreneurship, and B.A. Tourism and Travel Management) and six at the postgraduate level (M.Sc. Physics, M.A. Leadership in collaboration with Trinity Western University, Canada, M.A. Human Resource Management, M. Sc. Data Science in a tripartite collaboration with GITAA and Liverpool Hope University, and M. Sc. Psychology). She introduced GE online courses and the

Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework for all programmes and courses.

During her tenure, the College celebrated its semi-sesquicentennial year in 2022 with a series of organised activities, particularly the Sapphirus Cognitio Talk Series, which involved highly specialised and informative lectures by experts from various fields. As the 75th-year celebration ended, the grand finale saw the visit of the Honorable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Thiru. M.K. Stalin on 25 May 2022.

Her leadership skills and vision came to the fore during the pandemic when she oversaw the training of more than 200 faculty members in technological tools to continue the educational process of students through the online mode.

Under her able guidance, stewardship facilities and infrastructure have been enhanced and developed to meet the needs of growing student and faculty



communities. She was responsible for completing a new Academic Block called the Sancta Sofia Block with a Digital Media Center. She was pivotal in setting up Facilitated Academic Resource and Research (FARR) Center in collaboration with Trinity Western University, Canada. Under the DST-FIST programme, an e-learning recording room has been set up, and two new laboratories have been set up for the B. Voc. Programmes in Sustainable Energy Management and Food Processing and Quality Control. She has undertaken some developmental initiatives to obtain the Google Suite for Education for remote teaching during the lockdown, establish SCEED (Stella Centre for Effective Education and Development), and set up a high-tension generator on campus to ensure an uninterrupted power supply.

She has also received the Higher Education Excellence Award-2019 for Arts and Science Colleges, Chennai, conferred by Staffordshire University, UK, and was also awarded the IAB Blind Empowerment Champions 2020 by the Indian Association for the Blind in recognition of her voluntary contribution to the empowerment of

the visually challenged. During her tenure, The Xavier Board of Higher Education in India selected the College for the Sr. Hedwige Award for the Best College 2018-19 at the XXIII Triennial Conference of the Board on "Revisioning Higher Education in India – Challenges and Strategies for Catholic Institutions".

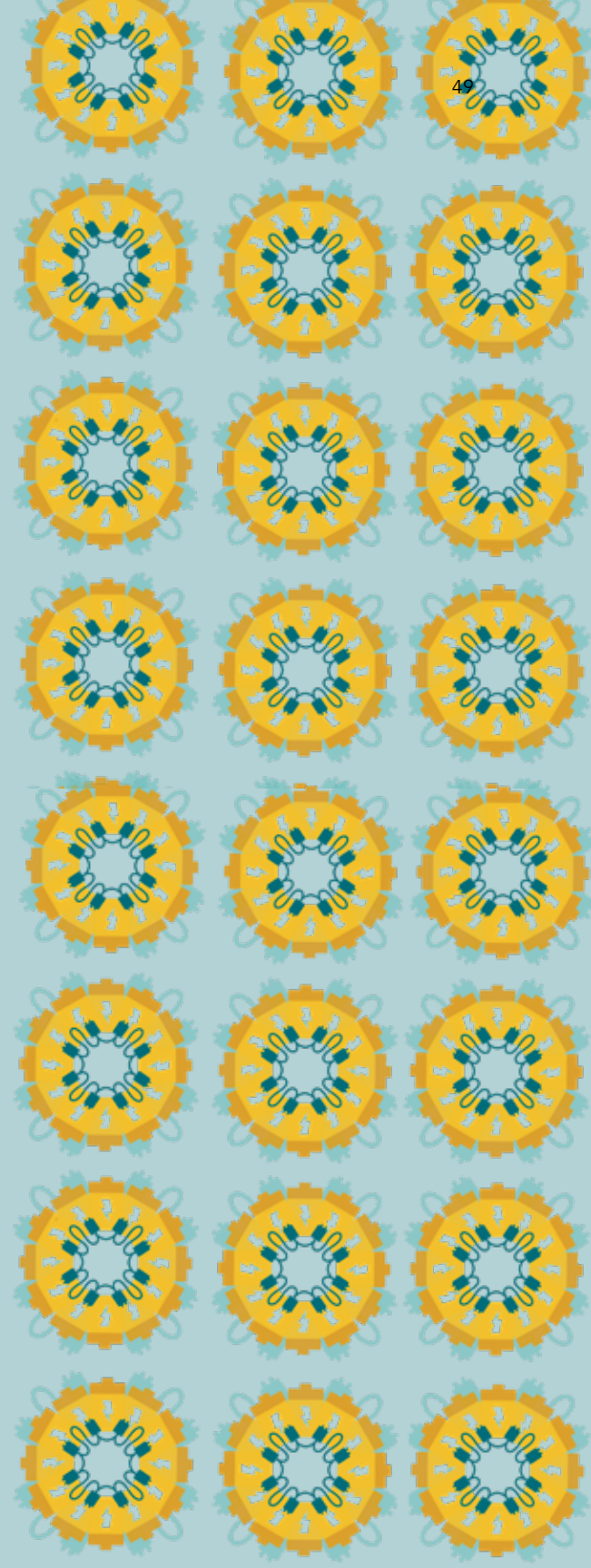
The establishment of the Jayashree Venkatraman Digital Learning and Research Centre, a state-of-the-art digital centre for technology-based learning/and research practices and training purposes, was her initiative. Several MoUs have been signed with international and national higher education institutions and industries to benefit both faculty and students through exchange programmes, internships, training, and placement.

She has been conferred with various awards, such as the Dr. Sam Higginbottom Award for the Best Principal of India (2020-21), in recognition of her educational leadership, devotion to academic excellence, the introduction of educational innovations, concern for the overall development of students,

She was also elected Vice-President of the Forum of Minority Institutions and Associations (FORMIA), at the Annual General Body Meeting of the FORMIA held on 30 November 2022.

Dr. Sr. Rosy Joseph's educational visits to different countries have benefited the institution by expanding its horizons. After 25 years of dedicated service, Dr. Sr. Rosy Joseph retired at the end of the academic year (2022-2023).





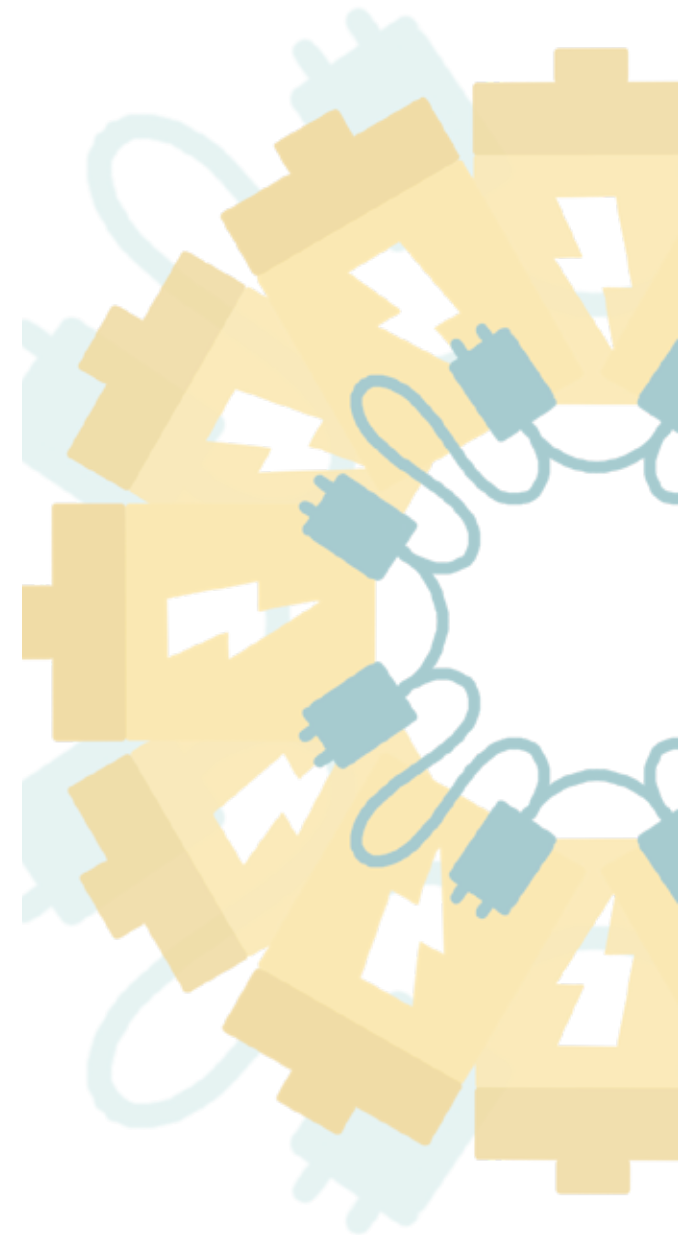
Ms. Zonita Mason

Her research publications in Fuzzy Mathematics have been internationally acclaimed as the basis for advanced studies. She has 34 International publications to her credit. Her scholarly achievement in this area

of mathematics was the pinnacle of her work, which was identified and quoted as Fuzzy Normed Linear Space Of The Felbin Type. She has over 795 citations for her research work. She has guided over 50 postgraduate students and five doctoral scholars through their dissertations. She has served as the corresponding and associate editor of special issues of some international journals in the field of mathematics. Dr. Felbin Kennedy is an anchor and resource for advancing Fuzzy Mathematics science.

She has been a resource at various conferences, seminars, and symposia. She initiated the international postgraduate programme in Data Science at Stella Maris College in collaboration with GITAA Research Park, IITM Chennai, and Liverpool Hope University, UK.

Dr. Felbin Kennedy is the recipient of various national awards. To name a few: the Distinguished Professor Award-2021 by the Institute of Researchers, India; the Bharat Shiksha Ratan Award by the Global Society for Health and Educational Growth, New Delhi, for excellence in the field of education; and the Bharat Seva Ratan Gold Medal by the Global Economic Progress and Research Association for Excellence in the Field of Education. She was a Fellow of the International Forum on Analysis in 2003 and was selected as the Best Officer Cadet DG Silver Plaque of Honour award (1995). She was also the General Secretary of the International Forum for Interdisciplinary Mathematics and was the domain expert for vetting Mathematics textbooks of grades 11 and 12.

She has retired from work after 30 years of dedicated service in the academia.

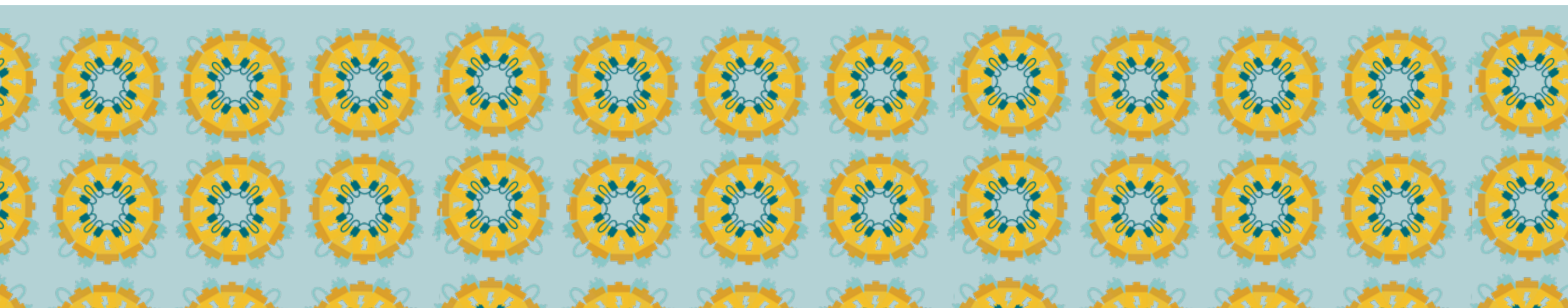
Auditing, Displacement, Women's Micro Enterprises, Women Construction Workers, Child Labour, Indigenous Persons, and Spirituality to name a few.

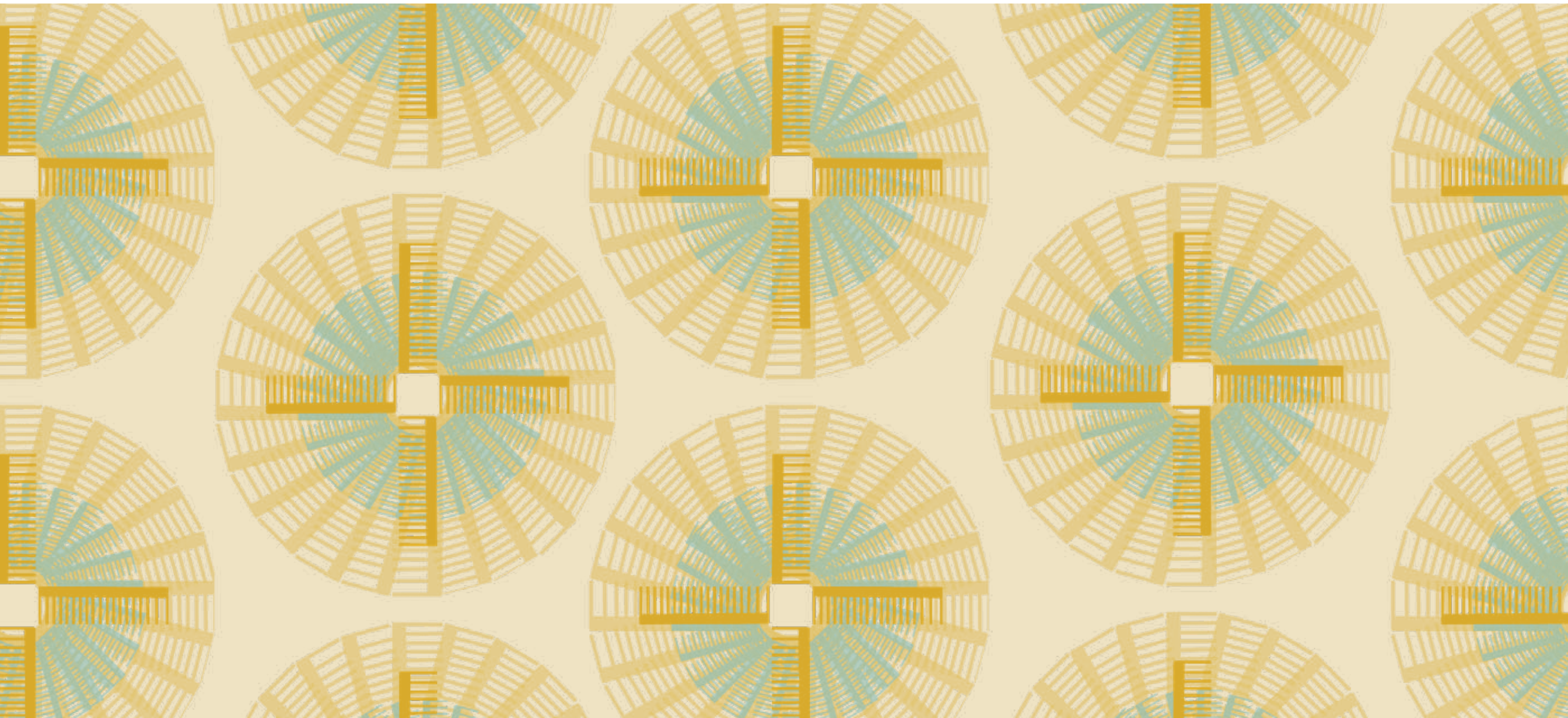
Dr. K. Shyamala

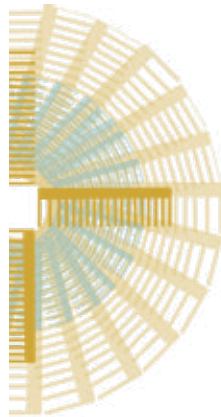
Sr. Susan Matheikal, fmm

of duty, her public relations skills helped her reach out to parents, benefactors, and friends of the College.

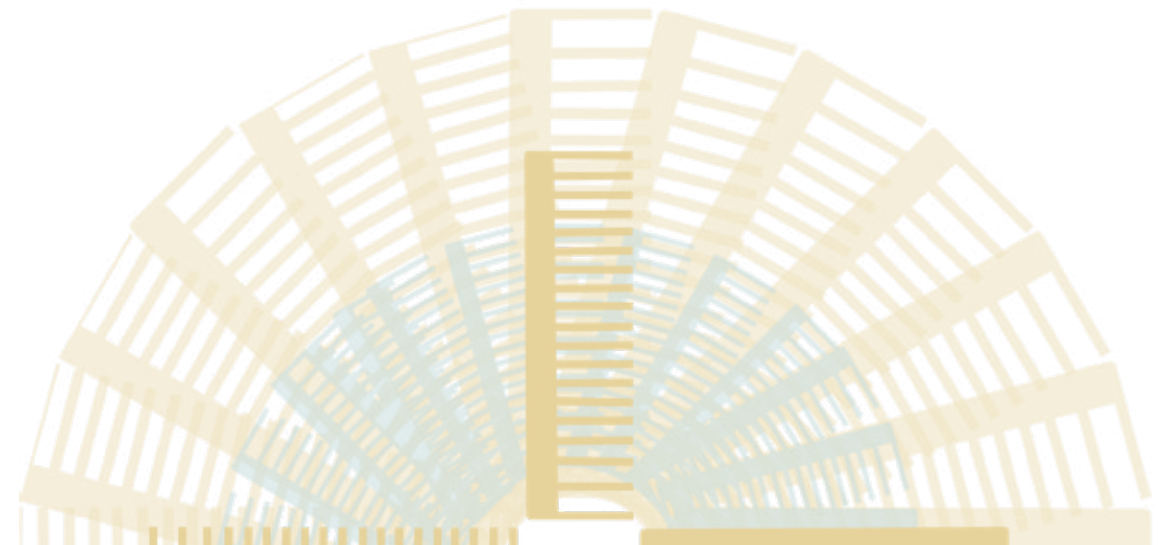

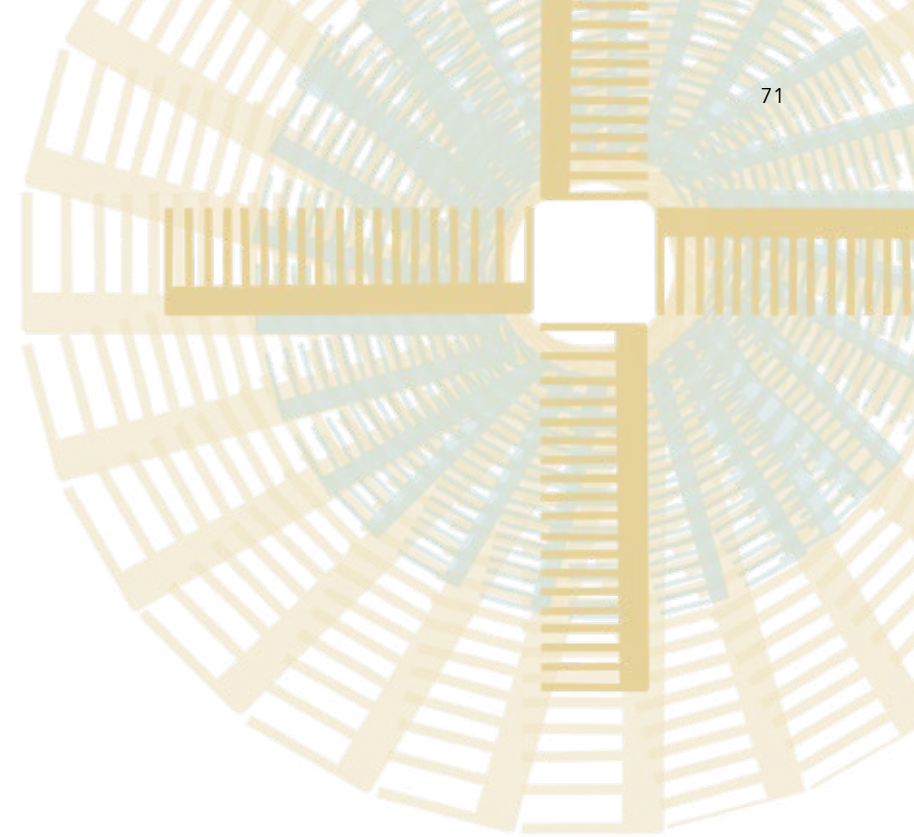
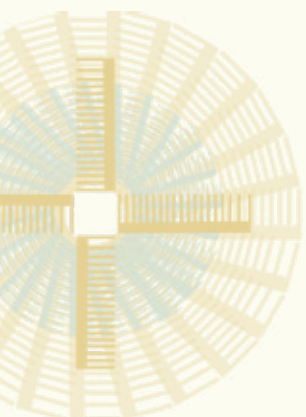




Dr. Sujata Ramanathan

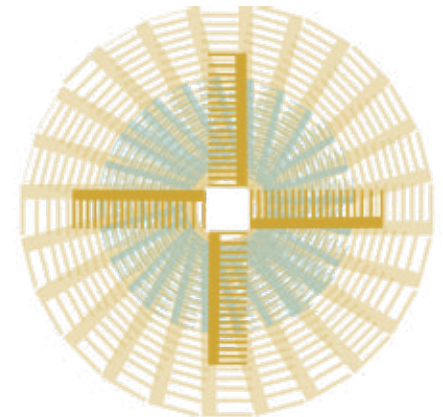

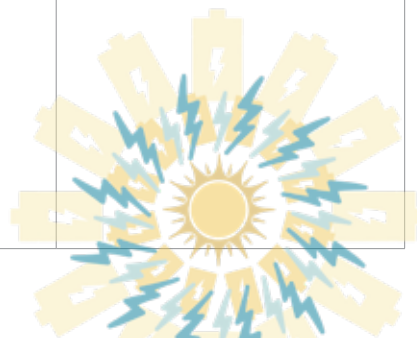

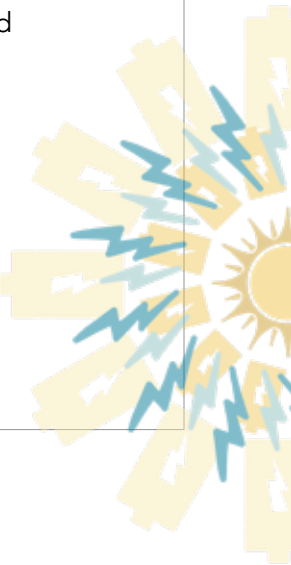

This year, 25 students from our College were selected to represent the Madras University B. Zone, and 5 students were chosen to represent the Madras University. The number of National Level representations was 6.



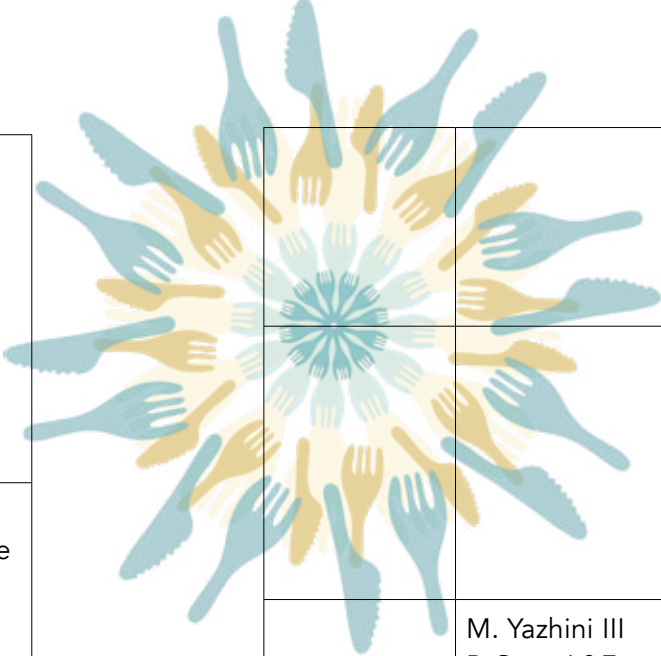

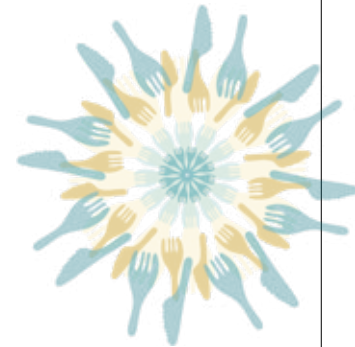

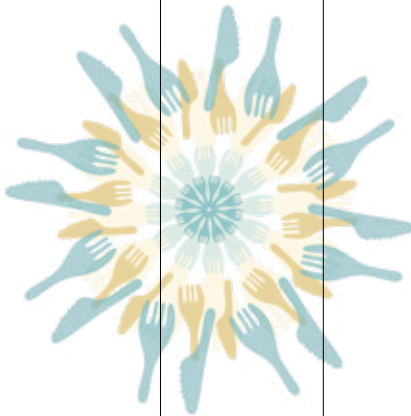

LIBRARY

The College Library encourages students to attain, assess and identify knowledge and to acquaint themselves with the trends of knowledge for further education and learning new disciplines.

The resources and services of the Library create prospects for learning, support literacy, and education, and help to form new ideas and outlooks that are central to a creative and modern society.

The activities of the Library for the academic year 2022-23 began with the induction of the newly admitted 1756 undergraduate and 519 postgraduate students.

The Library offers Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) that can bring knowledge to students who may not have access otherwise, and be of use to students who cannot afford the expenses of higher education. MOOCs is a useful form of online learning and can complement traditional university education. With the success of MOOCs, our College Library continues to encourage students to enroll in MOOCs through which 26 students passed the SWAYAM – NPTEL examination and 21 students completed



Coursera Certification for the July – December 2022 semester.

The SMC Library also established a soundproof Digital studio with a state-of-the-art facility on the third floor of Sancta Sofia block and video recorded classes for two General elective online courses in this venue.

The revamped Library webpage plays the role of a traditional Librarian in selecting the information resources, organising information resources, and providing access to information resources.

A new bookmark was designed and released to commemorate the 75th Jubilee year of Stella Maris College showcasing the salient features of the Library.

First of its kind, a one-day Regional Seminar 'The Landscape of Academic Libraries in the Digital Era' was organised by the Library on 08 October 2022 and 81 Library Professionals from all over Tamil Nadu participated in this seminar. To enhance accountability, accessioning the library books of the Department of English was done in December 2022. An exhibit of books by four reputed publishers aimed at inspiring the College fraternity's reading habits was organised on 07 February 2023.

PATHWAY PROGRAMME

The Stella Maris College Pathway Programme serves as a platform for students with limited access to employment opportunities. The programme, funded by the UGC Equal Opportunities Centre, aims to help students from the less privileged sections of society. It is directed at first-year undergraduate students with vernacular medium schooling. Students enrolled in the programme are provided with access to opportunities that hone employability skills.

The first session of the semester, on 'Confidence Building,' was conducted for students of Shift I on 9 March 2023. Ms. Angel Elizabeth Sebastian, Assistant Professor, Department of English and Communication Skills, Stella Maris College, was the resource person. She highlighted the different strategies for boosting levels of confidence. She also introduced participants to habits that foster positive thinking. On 29 March, a session on 'Personality Enrichment' was conducted by Dr. Lora Deva Prasanna, Coordinator, Stella Maris College Pathway Programme. She emphasised the need to overcome the fear of failure through proactive behaviour.

CENTRE FOR RESEARCH IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (CRIST)

The Centre for Research in Science and Technology (CRIST) has been providing instrumentation facilities for the students from the Department of Chemistry, Physics, Biotechnology, Bioinformatics and Botany for their undergraduate and postgraduate projects. The activities of the CRIST lab are supervised by Dr. Mary N. L., the Administrative Director.

The CRIST Lab has been periodically used by the PG students and research scholars of the Department of Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Chemistry and Physics. They have been effectively utilising the Weighing Balance, UV-Visible (DRS) Spectrophotometer, FT-IR (ATR) Spectrometer, Gel-Doc Imaging System, Millipore

Water Purifier, Rotary Evaporator, Probe Sonicator, Cooling Centrifuge, Orbital Shaker, Laminar Air Flow etc.

A Two-Day Intercollegiate regional workshop titled 'Instrumental Methods – WIM 2022' was organised by the Department of Chemistry in collaboration with CRIST on 12 and 13 September 2022. It was attended by postgraduate students doing their research oriented project work as well as faculty and PhD scholars who are engaged in research from the various city colleges.

A Two-Day workshop on 'Bionanotechnology and Bioinstrumentation' was organised by the Department of Biotechnology in collaboration with CRIST on 19 and 20 January 2023.

The DST-FIST instrumentation facility at CRIST Lab has been a great source of knowledge for our students. It has also enhanced the outsourcing capacities of the lab to students and research scholars of other colleges under the University of Madras. About 484 numbers of samples were presented for analysis at the Centre.

RESEARCH AND INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS CENTRE

The Research and International Partnerships Centre has crossed the year with moderate challenges as well as equal opportunities to learn, share, and deliver through hybrid and phygital modes, offering a range of services and events in 2022-23.

This was a pivotal year for advancing research and innovation while commemorating the decade-long establishment of the SMICMR with our collaborators across the globe. With an appreciation from our Council Advisory members we have launched tinkering labs to promote creativity and innovation with entrepreneurial outcomes. The social advocacy research in collaboration with TVS Srinivasan Trust and chaired by Mr Swaran Singh and a partnership with SkillsScape (incubated cell at IITM) to train researchers in academic writing and provide mentorship in writing for journal.

The Research Matters Series was created to overcome the challenges brought about by the pandemic. The series recreates virtual and real spaces to ideate and engage in dialogues enhancing the quality of research dissemination.

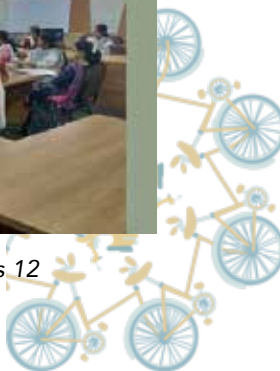

The centre has deployed strategies to foster a research ambience within our academic schedule, positioning research as our best practice at all levels of our academic programmes.

To enhance our global competitiveness, the Centre has leveraged partnerships with foreign universities, to enable students and faculty to participate in exchange programmes, study abroad tours and rigorous internships. Students and faculty mobility programmes were organised in the Binary University, Malaysia, and National University of Singapore. Students of the Department of Fine Arts, led by Dr. Sr. Fatima Furtado, participated in the one-month Maymester Arts Programme offered by the Liverpool Hope University, UK in May 2023. In collaboration with Trinity Western University, the Centre, along with the Departments of Sociology, History and Public Relations conducted a leadership conference in a phygital mode on the themes of leadership innovation in Education, Ecology, Social Environment, and Global Economy in

November 2022. Dr. Mark Husbands, President, TWU and Dr. Philip Laird, Vice-President led the proceedings of the one-day conference. With regard to our strategic partnerships, we have formalised academic linkages with the National University of Singapore and the California Baptist University, USA. Our collaboration with the University of Lille and the ICES, France has also been progressing with student exchange visits. We have made concrete plans for overseas faculty research enhancement with an active research

STELLA MARIS CENTRE FOR DEVELOPMENT OF RESOURCES FOR INCLUSION AND VOCATIONAL ENRICHMENT (SMCDRIVE)

Through SMCDRIVE Skills Development Centre 27523 participants have been trained in various Employability and Livelihood skills as (Digital Literacy, Soft skills, English communication, Tailoring and Beautician courses) from August 2019 – August 2022. These courses are organised in collaboration with the Bank of New York Mellon and the International Association for Human Values and they have been extended for three more years in recognition of its success. From April 2022, a Financial Literacy Training programme organised for 546 participants from the Kasimedu fishing community, SS puram and Stella Maris College support staff. Women from Ernavoor, Royapuram, Vysarpadi, Kasimedu Communities have continued to attend the Beautician and

Tailoring Courses at SMCDRIVE. 1148 Women candidates and 60 Recruiters participated in the Womens Job Fair organised on 23 July 2022 for college students. Media Workshop for Transwomen was organised between 12-14 September 2022. 15 Transwomen were trained in Folk Arts, Drama and Theatre Arts. From 10-14 November 2022, a Digital Literacy programme was conducted at Stella Maris College Extension Project Centre, Thirupachur, Tamil Nadu for 115 participants including 33 Women living with HIV infection from Positive Women Network.

As part of Christmas celebrations, ration kits were distributed to 33 HIV positive women and to 25 cancer survivors. Books were given to Arpanam Trust Library and food packets were distributed to 120 people experiencing economic insecurity.

A Four day Bangle Making Workshop was conducted for 20 Women from Kasimedu Community from 18 -21 December 2022. A three month certificate course in Sign Language has been initiated for the final year students of Stella Maris College from January 2023 onwards. On 14 February 2023, student interns distributed Pediasure and story books to children admitted to the Cancer ward, Egmore Children's Hospital, Chennai. The event was sponsored by Hyatt Hotels, Chennai. On 27 February 2023, an Eye Camp was conducted in collaboration with Rajan Eye Clinic at Nochikuppam Community, Chennai and 100 people were serviced and treated. In March 2023, 22 queer individuals, burn and domestic violence victims from the International Foundation for Crime Prevention and Victim Care completed the employability skills course.

This visit for networking aimed at quality enhancement resulted in the signing of an MoU with a subsequent visit from the partner institution.

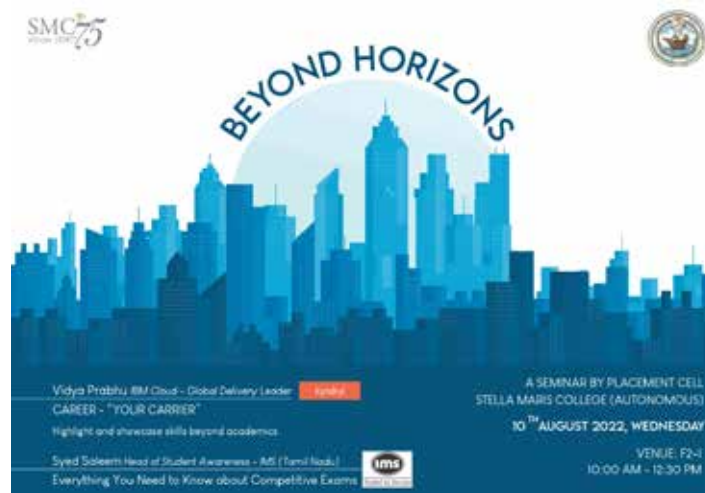
In March, two online FDP programme exclusively held for the Micro Quality Cell faculty members marked the finale of the yearlong activities of the IQAC.

SSG Leadership Training Programme 2022

LANGUAGE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMME (LPP)

The Language Partnership Programme (LPP) focuses on providing individual and personalised assistance to first and second-year students who need help with honing their English language skills. This assistance is provided by student volunteers from the Department of English.

The learners were identified by their course teachers after which they were counselled to enroll for LPP classes. They were then partnered with senior students who met them once or twice a week to practise spoken and written skills, as well as grammar exercises.

From July to October 2022, 10 student teachers from the Department of English conducted classes for 10 second-year students from various departments. An average of 18 classes were conducted during this period. From December 2022 to March 2023, ten student volunteers helped 10 first-year students from various departments. An average of 15 classes were conducted during this period.

CENTRE FOR WOMEN'S STUDIES (CWS)

International Women's Day was celebrated with the usual fervor on 8 March 2023. The Centre co-hosted the celebrations with the Gender Centre. A special session was held at the open air Theatre for the entire College to celebrate, recognise and appreciate the contributions and achievements of women in various fields, and the Centre had invited two distinguished women - leaders in their own fields, to inspire the students with their unique narratives. A workshop on 'How to enhance our Feminine Power' was held on 1 November 2022 with Ms. Nirupama Subramanian Founder & CEO Powerful life Solutions. The workshop gave an idea as to how women can tap into their inner power and overcome the barriers created through centuries of patriarchy.

The student's wing of Damini Club, with 294 members has been active participants in all the activities of the Club. The Vision of the club is to sensitise, educate and empower students to work towards the creation of a just and egalitarian society that upholds the dignity and equality of women in India. The Club engaged the students throughout the year with numerous activities such as Nirangal, a group discussion event

that centred on topics relating to the participation of women in the workforce, gender discrimination and the wage gap, and how students as policy makers can bring about amendments in the system for women to progress in the society.

A quiz series Conoscenza was organised for the members of the club students to mark Women Equality Day. 'Dil se Dil Tak' - a platform where the members came together online to have heart-to-heart conversations about life, relationships, ambitions, well being and gender roles.

As a culmination of the events, a rally invigorated the students with a feeling of solidarity and oneness.



GENDER CENTRE

The SMC Gender Center kick started its yearly activities with a film screening and discussion in collaboration with The Soroptimist International, a global volunteer organisation, dedicated to provide women and girls with access to the education and training they need to achieve economic empowerment. 'Vamsama Paasama', a short film by Ms. Sujatha Balakrishnan, which raised critical questions on gender roles was screened followed by a panel discussion on the focal theme of the session 'He for She'.

Ms. Sreelatha Narayan and Ms. Swapna Sundar released the second edition newsletter of the Gender center, 'Be you', which is a brief compilation of all events conducted in 2021-22 and creative outputs from Gender Center members.

The yearly 'Back to Basics' session was conducted online in September, in collaboration with The Gender Lab, Mumbai.

The Gender Center conducted an expressive arts therapy session in an attempt to help students explore

In collaboration with the International Foundation for Crime Prevention and Victim Care PCVC, SMC Gender Centre held an informative session on 'Gender based Violence', in which students were exposed to knowledge on gender-based atrocities.

Open mics are one of the most looked forward to events among the student community. The Gender Center organised an open mic event, on the topic "Break the Silence", intending to provide a liberating platform for students to express themselves freely and creatively.

SMC Gender Center and the Center for Women's Studies along with the Soroptimist International organised the very first International Symposium on the topic "Rule of Law and Gender Disparity", involving veterans from various areas of work from around the globe. Hon. Retd Justice Prabha Sridevan, presented the keynote address along with an engaging interactive session. Prof Xin Ren, Adv. M Parvathi Srinivasan, Adv. Swapna Sundar and Ms. Manonmani were the panellists of the day with Dr. Lora Deva Prasanna moderating the session.

SMC Gender Center in collaboration with the Soroptimist International took up research on 'Law and Gender Disparity', to which the International Symposium highly contributed. Resourceful focus group discussions with Law students from colleges including Saveetha Law School and Dr. Ambedkar Law University were conducted as part of the data collection.

The members of the research group took part in a first of its kind moot court session. Students presented themselves as young legal practitioners and engaged with each other in a case of divorce. Students thereby got a first hand experience of courts and its proceedings. The Gender Center along with the Center for Women's Studies held a book talk on "Sisterhood Economy" with the author, and co-founder of shethepeople TV,

Ms. Shaili Chopra herself presiding over the session. The session explored the significance of sisterhood ties and the power it holds to run an economy.

In collaboration with the KanyaRaksha Foundation, an organisation committed to end female gendercide through holistic care, education, and training for girl children across the country, the Gender Center held an engaging workshop on 'Female Gendercide'.

Incorporating the themes of the 18th G20 Summit 2023, the Gender Centre held a week-long array of competitions in celebrating the themes of inclusive and equitable growth for all. The competitions included a photography competition on the topic 'Women in Action', which sought for students to capture women in unique and challenging fields, a news headline rewriting competition, an eco-friendly stamp designing competition and a short story writing competition which encouraged students to get creative and amplify their voices for the right causes.

With that SMC Gender Center successfully completed another year empowering young minds through education and creating awareness among the student community on issues of gender disparity and garnering support for the marginalised communities.



STELLA MARIS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT STUDENTS' HUB

Environmental responsibility and sustainability has always been at the forefront of activities at Stella Maris College. With the setting up of the Stella Maris Sustainable Development (SMSD) Students' Hub in 2022, the College has created a platform to amplify the tremendous energy and capabilities of the student community in generating broader buy-in for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

On 12 August 2022, Stella Maris College collaborated with the United Nations SDG Students Programme to host the International Youth Day Programme – a state level event organised to enlighten students on pressing global concerns and to ignite change makers across

The hub is a student driven programme modeled on the United Nations SDG Students Programme with three operating wings in the areas of Education, Solutions and Community.

The SMSD Students' Hub has successfully seen through the completion of four initiatives. Project C involved the collection of well-maintained clothes from the student community to set up a 'Just for a Day Boutique' at Semmenchery. Mental Health Week was celebrated with competitions and talks by specialists. 'Know Your SDGs' series drummed up a lot of enthusiasm among the students as the hub coordinators used several innovative methods to create awareness on the 17 SDGs.

The TN SDG Girls Championship 2022, a state-wide initiative organised in collaboration with the UN SDG Students Program, StartupTN and eight partnering colleges across the state had around 3800 participants. The Finals of the competition was conducted at Stella Maris College on 7 March 2023. Under the Climate Change Outreach Programme the hub is in the process of providing training to a group of 45 'Climate Change Warriors' who will conduct workshops orienting school children on the causes and consequences of Climate Change.

With the conclusion of its first year the hub has successfully facilitated the creation of student-inspired innovative solutions and has aided in connecting local action with global advocacy.

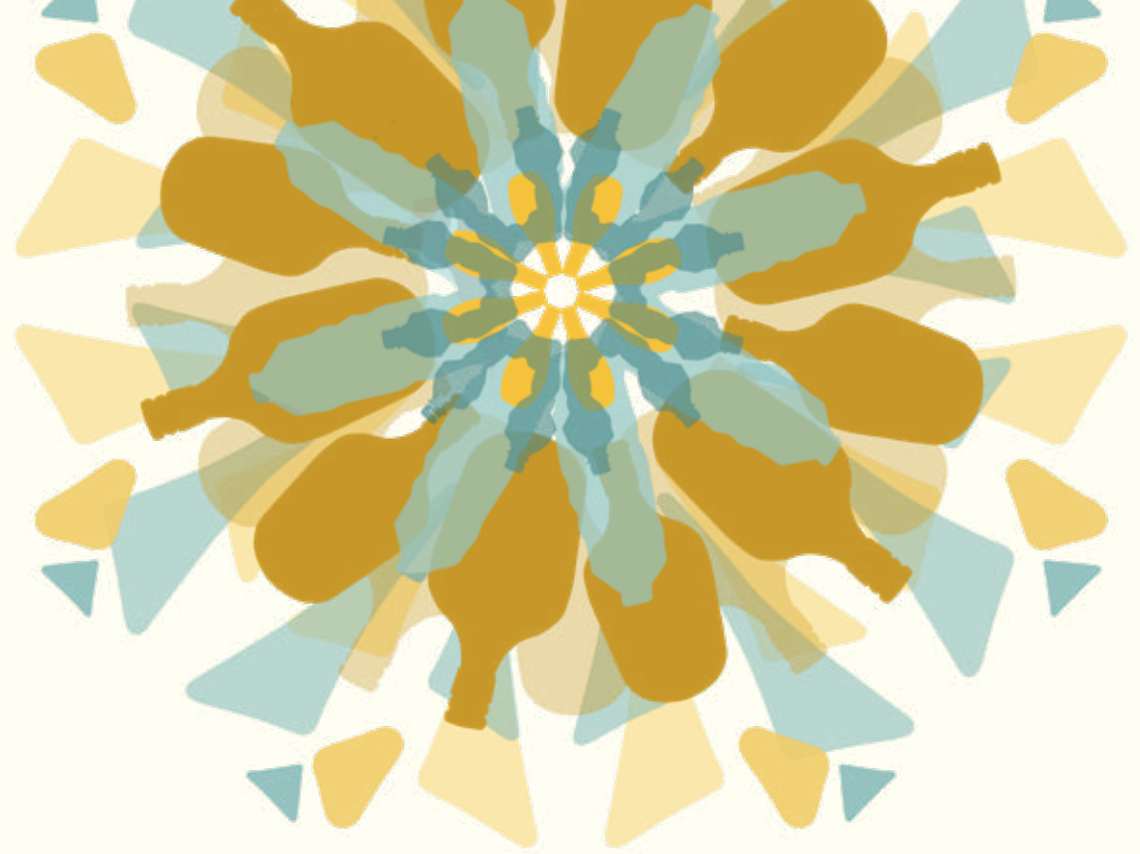

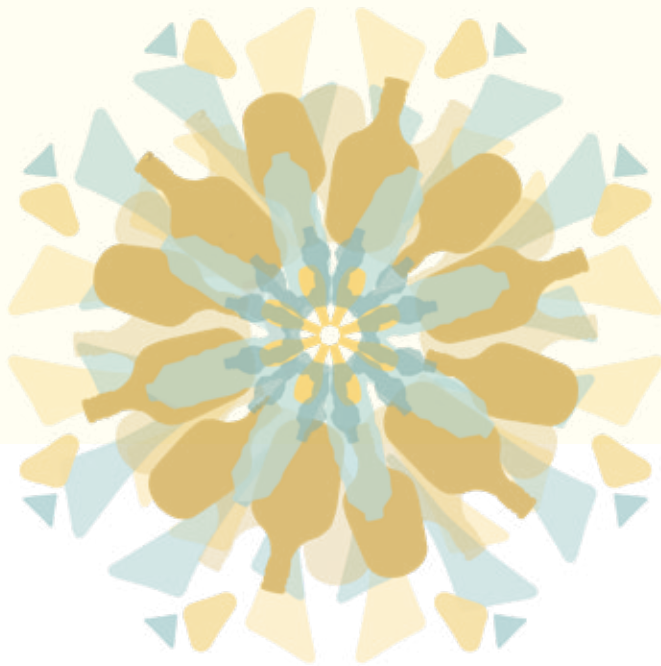

ENGLISH (Shift II)

HISTORY

The Department of History turns 75 in 2023. The inaugural celebrations of this special year began on 14 February 2023 with an International Symposium on The Contemporary World. One significant milestone for our Department was the introduction of the BA Tourism and Travel Management programme in addition to the existing BA History and Tourism programme. 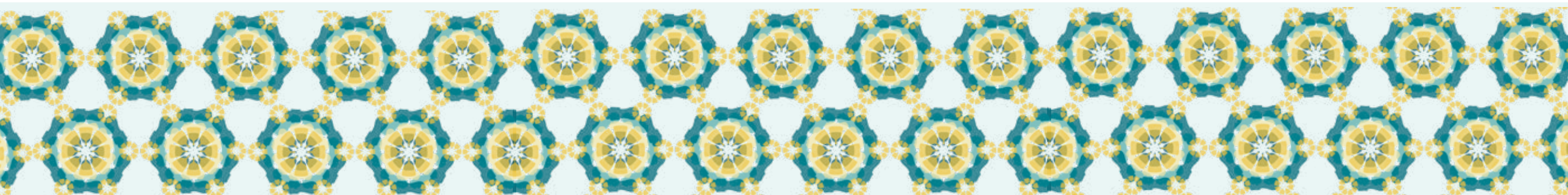

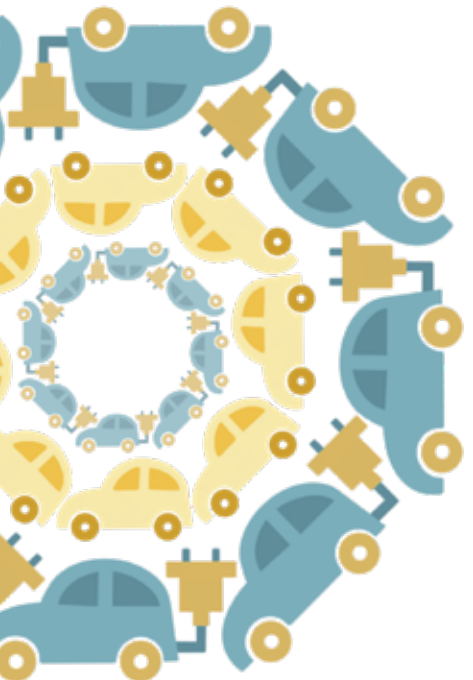


SOCIOLOGY

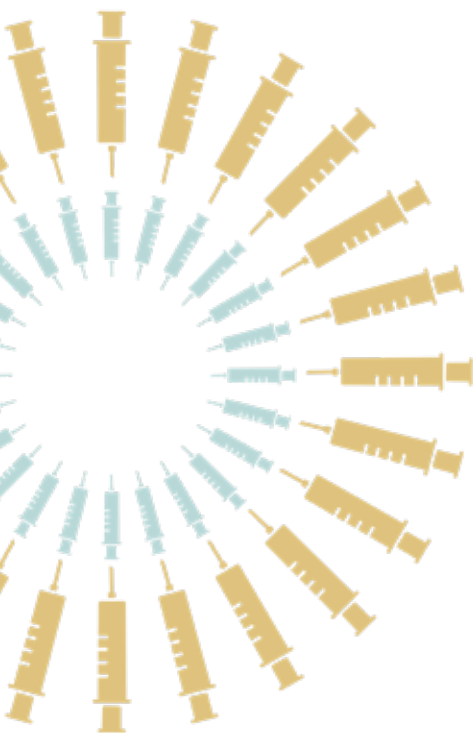

This brought about an awareness of essential instrumental techniques required for postgraduate and doctoral research with hands-on experience through demonstrations of high-end instruments. An awareness programme on Solid Waste and Waste Water Management was conducted on 18 October 2022 in collaboration with The Enviro Club and Department of Economics of Stella Maris College.

Ltd., Chennai. The Department has three MoUs signed with TNQ Technologies Pvt. Ltd, International

Centre for Clean Water (ICCW), Chennai and Anabond Ltd.

Two incubation projects were initiated by the Department with an aim to benefit society at large using eco-friendly methods – 'Sustainable Material for the Treatment of Laboratory Waste Water' in collaboration with International Centre for Clean Water (ICCW)-An IIT Madras Initiative and 'Cosmetic Formulations for Skin and Hair' in collaboration with Visual Difference, Chennai. The projects are sponsored by MRF, Chennai and an incubation center has been set up in the College. These projects would help in creating self-sufficiency in the lab with respect to water, encourage product development and strengthen the knowledge and skills of the students. This year saw a total of 18 publications in journals listed in Scopus and UGC CARE. Faculty also attended and presented papers in national and

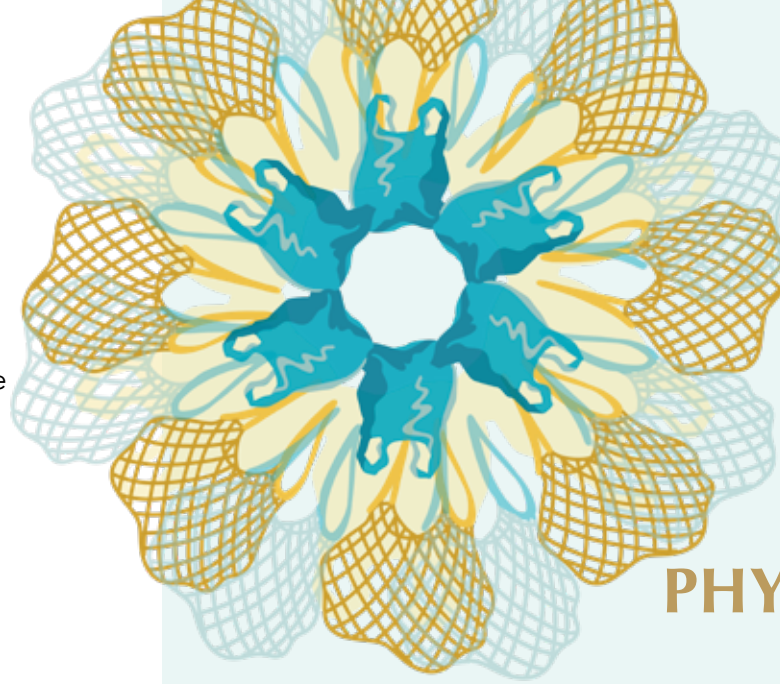

PHYSICS

The Department of Physics organised a series of workshops and seminars at both international and national levels for students to provide an exposure to current technologies and advancements in the field of sciences.

The Department organised an industrial trip for III B.Sc. and II M.Sc. Physics students to Mithradham renewable energy centre, Aluva, Kochi, Kerala from 13 October to 15 October, 2022 to expose them to the functioning of the energy centre, thereby encouraging an active engagement with sustainable living and development.

A workshop on 'Physics behind '0's and '1's' was organised on 18 October 2022 with the II M.Sc. students training the I B.C.A. students of the College to impart practical knowledge on digital electronics through equipment handling and demonstration.

In collaboration with Tamil Nadu Astronomy and Science Society (TASS); Vigyan Prasara, DST, Government of India and Chennai Astro Club, the

Department organised a ‘Seminar and Discussion on Astronomy’ on 21 December, 2022. Mr. Lenin Tamilkovan, Scientific officer, Birla Planetarium, Chennai, gave insights into the technological advances in tracking the locations of planetary bodies using readily available applications such as Indian Sky map, IBS satellite, Solar system Scope etc.

An International Seminar on ‘Smart Decisions for Environment and Climate Change: Big Data, Complexity and Uncertainty’, was organised on 24 January 2023 as part of the Popular Lecture Series with Dr. Timothy O. Randhir, Professor (Full) of Watersheds/ Water, Ecohydrology, Complex systems, Ecol. Econ, Sustainability, Department of Environmental Conservation, University of Massachusetts, USA addressing the audience about mitigation, environmental conservation and the

climatic impacts on watershed systems. He also shared information on career opportunities to pursue higher studies abroad.

A Research Lab and the PG Physics Lab were inaugurated by Fr. Antony Pancras, Editor and Director, The new Leader Magazine, Chennai on 11 January, 2023. 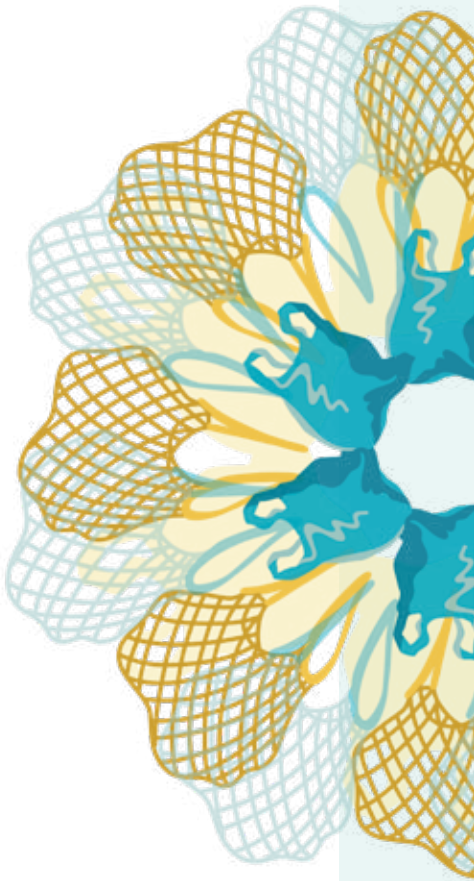

MATHEMATICS

The Department of Mathematics, Stella Maris College, has successfully completed 70 glorious years of educating young minds. To commemorate this momentous occasion, the Department organised a Scholar in Residence (SIR) with workshops and seminars commencing from September 2022 to March 2023. Eight workshops were organised, with 17 eminent Professors from around the globe delivering lectures. Researchers, UG and PG students from city colleges attended these workshops and seminars.

As the crowning glory of these events, the Department has associated itself with the 'Visitor Programme Lecture Series' by Indian Women and Mathematics, in collaboration with 'National Board For Higher Mathematics', the Government of India, and the International Mathematical Union Committee for Women in Mathematics.

As part of the programme, Prof. Ariane Mezard, Sorbonne University, Paris, delivered a lecture on 3 March 2023. The series was organised in a blended mode to ensure maximum participation of researchers and resource persons across the globe.

A guest lecture on Statistics titled 'Skew Symmetric Matrices, Minimax Theorem, and Decision' by Professor T. Parthasarathy, Adjunct Professor, Chennai Mathematical Institute, India, was organised by the Department on 29 July 2022 enabling students to pursue research in this area. This year was an outstanding year for the Research Department of Mathematics where seven research scholars: Dr. K Meenakshi and Dr. Amalore Arumica (supervised by Dr. Felbin C Kennedy), Dr. Padmavathy E, Dr. Fancy V F, Dr. Sravya P R and Dr. Sindiya Therese S

(supervised by Dr. V Jude Annie Cynthia) and Dr. Diana Grace Thomas (supervised by Dr. Shanthi A S) have successfully completed their Viva-Voce Examinations. Seven research scholars have submitted their thesis and three new scholars have joined the research family. The faculty and scholars have produced 17 publications this year.

Two of the faculty members - Dr. Fancy V F and Dr. Sindiya Therese S received their doctoral degrees this year. The 'Journal of Advanced Computational Intelligence and Intelligent Informatics', Vol. 27 No.1, ISSN 1343-0130 issued on Jan 2023 has published research papers presented at the International Conference on 'Recent Strategies in Mathematics and Statistics – ICRSMS 2022' organised by the Department of Mathematics in collaboration with IIT Madras between

19 and 21 May 2022. This year, two more journals will be brought out to publish the other papers presented at ICRSMS 2022.

A Design Patent was conferred to Dr. Sarah Surya S and Ms. Subbulakshmi P for 'Device for Security of Wireless Transactions' by the Patent Office, Government of India, in February 2023. The Department has organised three certificate courses this year: Analytics 101, Mathematics for Competitive Exams and Programming in C++ this year.

A mega exhibition on several topics in mathematics was organised on 9 March 2023. The exhibits and models that our students presented were open to school students. They also participated in the Olympiad conducted on the day and were awarded prizes.

The students also had a night sky observation session on 1 April 2023, watching the bright moon and the planets through the telescope mounted on the terrace of CC Block in the College.

The III B.Sc. students of Shift II went on a three-day educational tour to Wayanad on 10 December 2022, visiting the Indian Institute of Management, Kozhikode, and the II M.Sc. students visited Bangalore for a short industrial visit to 'The Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum', Bangalore on 20 January 2023.

The Department inaugurated its exclusive library in the Maria block on 1 March 2023, enabling easy access to resources for all our students.

The students of the Department of Mathematics have excelled in both co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Ms. Nivedita (I M.Sc. Mathematics student) has cleared the GATE examination in 2023. Two of our undergraduate students, Megha Mariam Jose and Archana S. attended classes on Entrepreneurship, Negotiation, Leadership, Psychology

and social innovation, Financial and Digital technology and Environment at the Binary University, Malaysia, from 18 August 2022 to 28 August 2022. The first Graduation Day of the International programme in M.Sc. Data Science, offered by Stella Maris College in collaboration with Liverpool Hope University and GITAA, was held on 12 September 2022. Several popular talks by eminent Professors with a focus on data science and the related problems were also organised. ZOOLOGY

Many species of wildlife are disappearing globally and conservation measures are required to prevent this. In order to make students aware of the beauty and value of biodiversity, the Department celebrated Wildlife Week through several activities including a wildlife conservation rally in college on 8 October 2022. A skit by I B.Sc. students brought out the causes and challenges of human-elephant conflict and its mitigation. The II B.Sc. class through their thought-provoking posters, made the student-body aware of several endangered faunal species and the threats they face.

The Department took part in a Nature Education Initiative in collaboration with the Indian Bird Photography Society. Mr. Akhilesh Kumar Sahay, Nature Educator and Author and Founder President of Dhanbad Birders and the Indian Bird Photography Society spoke to the students about his experiences in capturing natural history moments in his talk on 'Nature Education through Photography' on 9 December 2022. A workshop on GIS (Geographic Information System) Mapping for Conservation was organised on 20 January 2023 by the Department in collaboration with the NGO, Care Earth Trust (CET). The participants included faculty and research scholars from local city colleges. During the one-day workshop, participants learnt the

fundamental concepts of GIS, field data collection, map visualisation techniques and analysis using open-source GIS software applications.

The Department introduced a new Certificate Course titled 'Winged Wonders: A Basic Course in Butterfly Studies'. Students learnt about the types, life cycle and behaviour of these beautiful insects and the threats faced by them. They were also sensitised to the role played by butterflies in the ecosystem. By the end of the course, students learnt to conduct 'Butterfly Walks' on campus and to document butterflies using citizen science platforms. A field trip to Tholkappiar Poonga was organised on 22 October 2022 as part of the course.

The Department conducted 'Moth Week at SMC' for the first time in the last week of July 2022. Awareness programmes and competitions were held on the theme of moth diversity.

Students and faculty documented moths on campus during Moth Night. 'Another First' was the new theme for our Service Learning Programme – 'Faunal Diversity and Conservation'. As part of this, students visited a few local schools to carry out biodiversity surveys there and familiarised school students with the biodiversity on their school campus and its conservation through presentations, games, activities and nature walks on the school campus.

This year too, several students interned with organisations like Care Earth Trust

(CET), the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) and the Madras Naturalists' Society (MNS), which has enriched their learning experience. The Dr. Meera Paul & Dr. Hannah John Endowment Lecture was delivered by Dr. K A Subramanian, Scientist E & Officer-in-charge, Southern Regional Centre, Zoological Survey of India, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India on 15 December 2022. Dr. Subramanian spoke on 'Monitoring Freshwater Ecosystems with Aquatic Macroinvertebrates'. The lecture brought out the importance of indicator species in monitoring freshwater ecosystems and hence, in conservation.

Some of the regular events that were conducted included the workshops on 'Drosophila Culture Techniques,' on 18 August 2022 and 'Methodology for Studying Animal Behaviour' on 10 February 2023. The Butterfly Week was conducted between 26 and 30 September 2022 and the Campus Bird Count was between 17 and 20 February 2023. 32 species of birds were documented during the Count. With over 150 checklists being submitted by faculty and students during the Count, our College campus once again figures among the top ten colleges in India with respect to the number of checklists submitted.

An interdepartmental workshop - cum-lecture series on Research Methodology was conducted between July and October 2022.

'EXZOOBITION', the annual exhibition on the various facets of Zoology was held on 24 March 2023. The exhibition, held at the Open-Air Theatre for the first time, attracted several footfalls and was highly appreciated for the information imparted through creative and colourful models. The exhibits pertained to Microbiology, Ecology and Chordates. Synapse 2022-23, the intercollegiate fest of the Department, was conducted on 17 February 2023. More than 110 students across nine city colleges participated in various events. The overall winners were Loyola College (Autonomous), Chennai. The inaugural address was given by Mr. Alistair Fernandez, Pearl Aqua Systems, Chennai, who spoke on 'Trends and Opportunities in the Ornamental Fish Industry'.

The final year students undertook an educational trip to the Shell Museum and Aquarium at Mamallapuram on 13 February 2023. The II B.Sc. Zoology students visited several labs such as the Microbiology, Biotechnology, Cell and Molecular Biology labs and Dairy and Poultry units at the Veterinary College, Vepery, on 2 March 2023. Students of the Certificate Course in Medical Biotechnology visited the Central Leather Research Institute on 19 October 2022. Students of

Competing against 1032 teams from across Tamil Nadu, the team comprising Keerthi Vijay, Annette B Sebastian and Rani Sabloo were declared winners of the Zonal Level Competition of the Chennai Zone. Much to our pride, their idea made it to the top five research ideas in the state.

The faculty of the Department have constantly been upgrading their

PSYCHOLOGY

The academic year 2022-23 has been a significant year for the Department of Psychology, as a new Master's programme (M.Sc. in Psychology) was introduced in October 2022. Following this, the Department's strength and its facilities increased with the addition of a postgraduate laboratory in Francis Block.

During the course of the year, the Department has organised various events like seminars, panel discussions, workshops, and intercollegiate competitions. The first seminar under the titled 'Applying Psychology Beyond the Classroom: An Educational Psychology Perspective' was conducted on 26 July 2022. In connection with Suicide Prevention Awareness Day, the Department organised a panel discussion on 16 September 2022 in collaboration with Emote, a mental health consultancy. 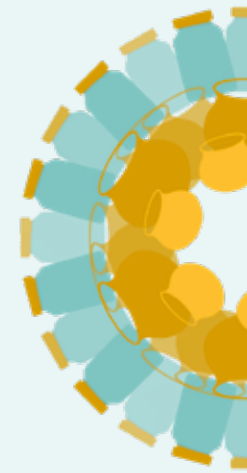

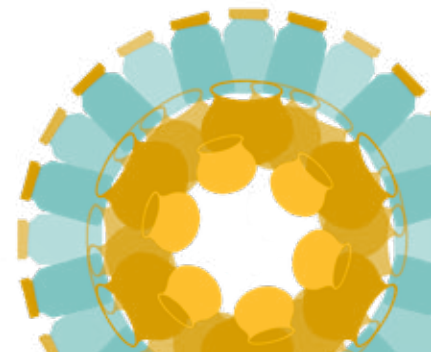


PUBLIC RELATIONS

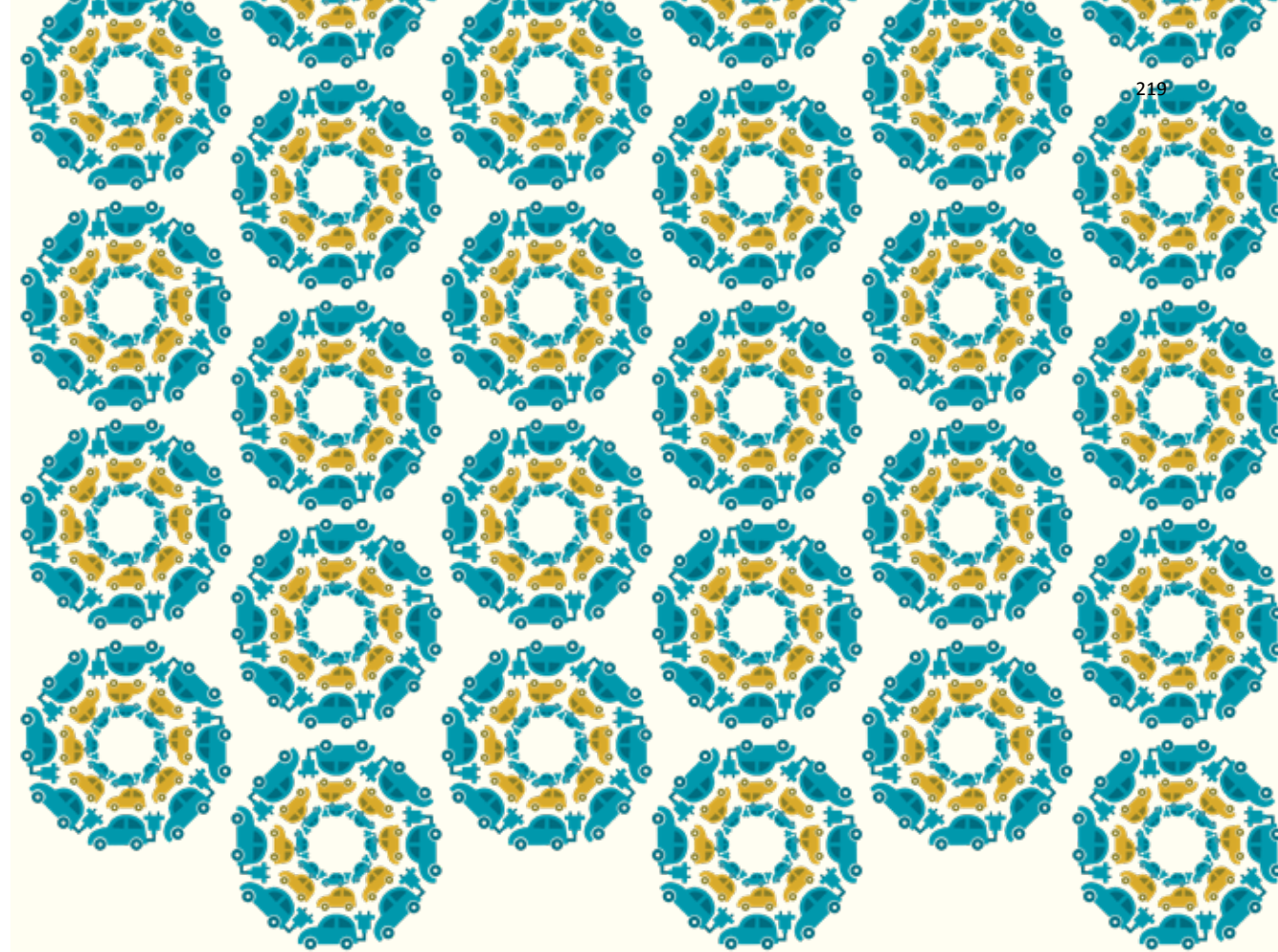

The participants were asked to describe the picture in French in 10–15 lines. They were given 40 minutes to complete the task. Fabrication des cartes de Noël (card making) was an online submission event. Participants had to make a Christmas card with a message in French.

On 3 March 2023, the Department of French and Le Cercle Des Francophiles in collaboration with The Association of Indian Teachers of French and the Quebec Government Office, organised an event where M. Francis Paradis, Consul and Director of Quebec Government Office, Mumbai, delivered a lecture on ‘Discover Quebec’.

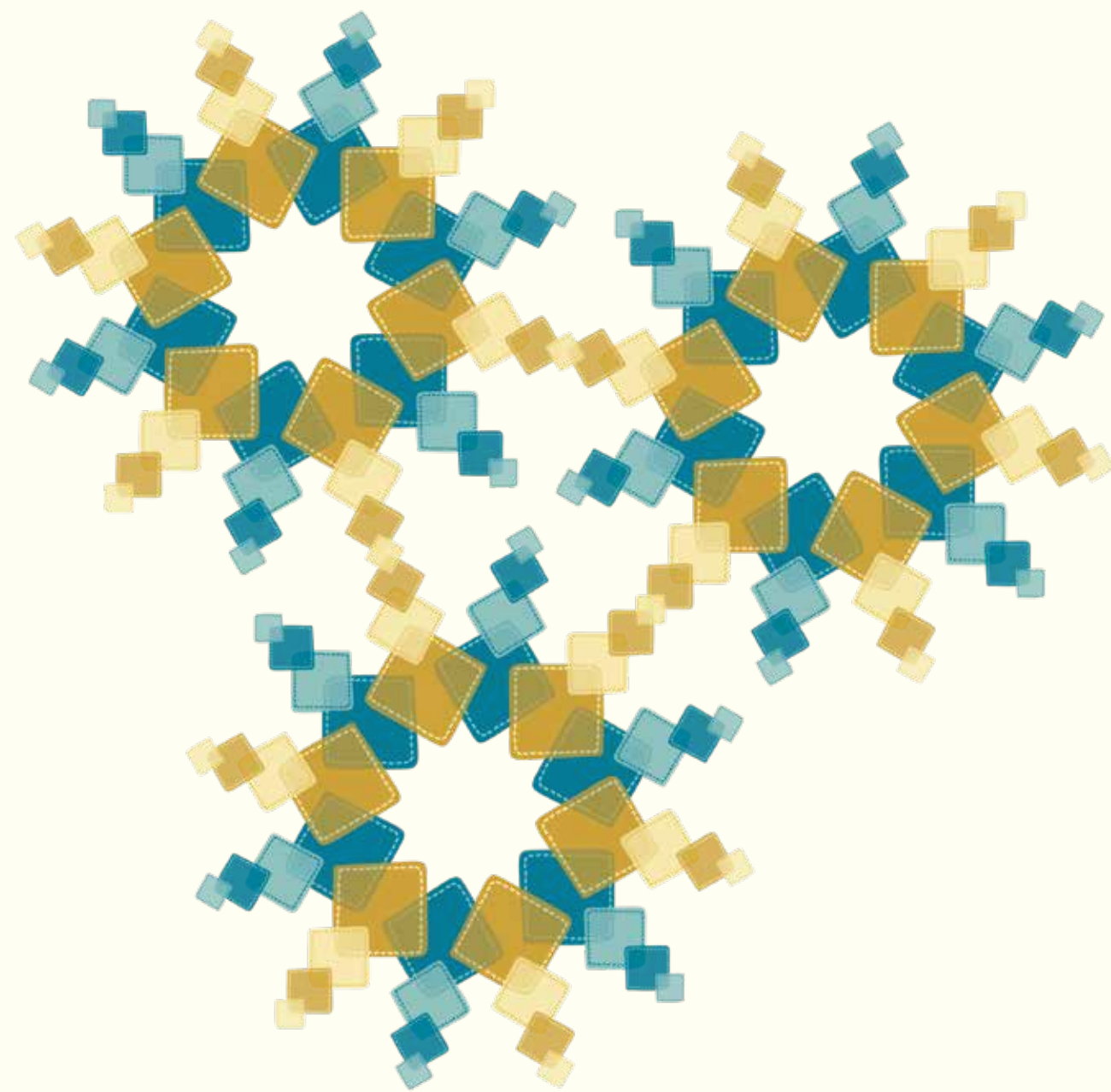
Government Office and the Association of Indian Teachers of French added significant value to the event, making it a great success.

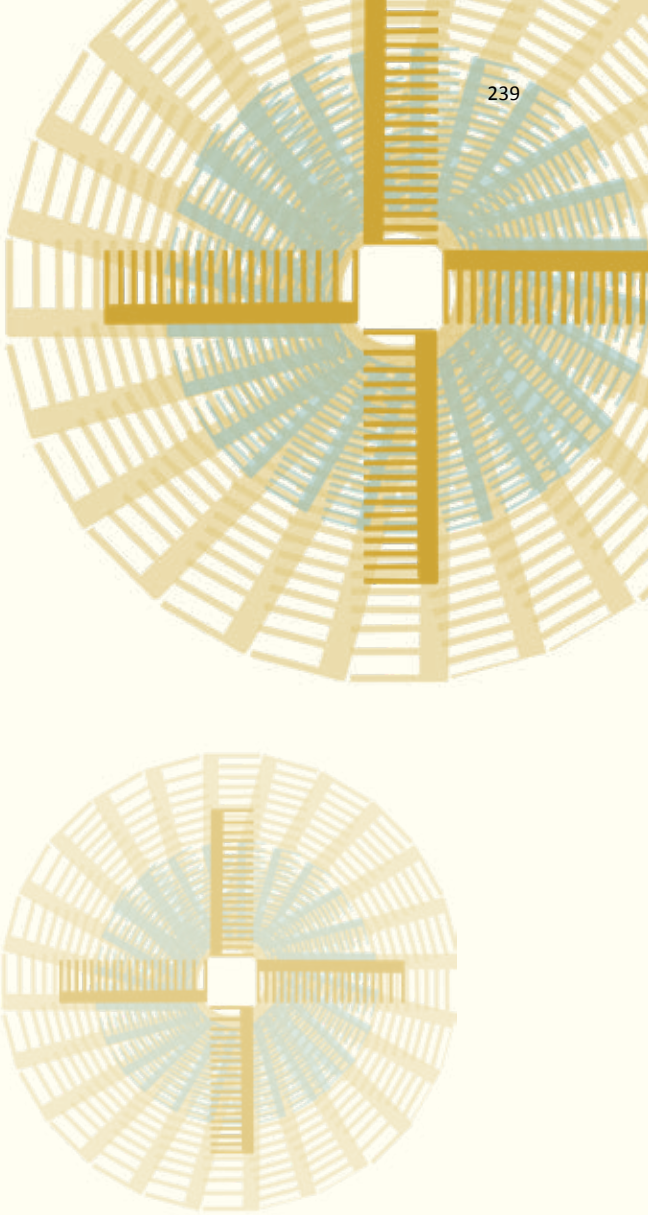

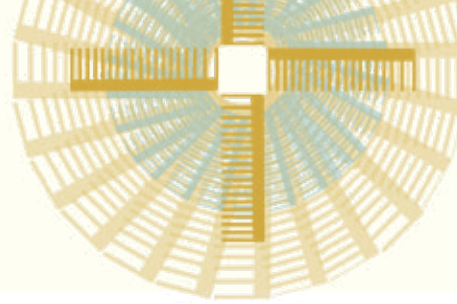

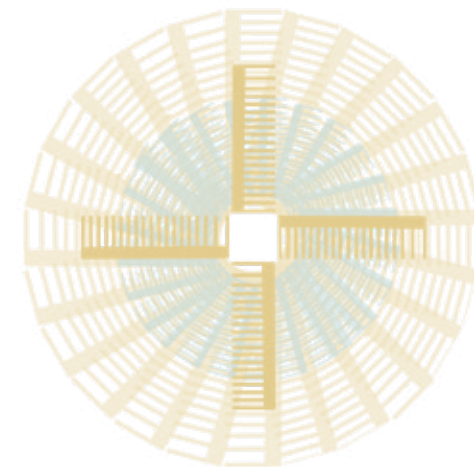

Srimad Bhagavad Gita on Familism

उद्धरेदात्मनात्मानं नात्मानमवसादयेत् ।

आत्मैव ह्यात्मनो बन्धुरात्मैव रिपुरात्मनः ॥ (SBG VI.5)

The study is based on the relevance of family values reflected in Srimad Bhagavad Gita between Generation X and their offspring in Generation Z. Generation X is operationally defined as the generation of people born between early to mid-1960s to 1980 and Generation Z is operationally defined as the generation of people born between 1995 to 2015. The null hypothesis of the study states that there exists no change in family values between Generation X and Generation Z. For the study, the data was collected vide a small sample of ten, 5 each from Gen X and Gen Z respectively. Family Apgar Questionnaire* was used to collect information about functional components of adaptability, partnership, growth, affection and resolve. It permits qualitative measurement of the family values and family dynamics and family members' satisfaction. This study was based on social learning theory which suggests that children can learn and imitate by observing others actions. To test the null hypothesis, Student t test (William Sealy Gosset, 1908) was done and the null hypothesis was rejected as there was a significant change in family values between the two generations.

The concepts of attachment and detachment are emphasized in Srimad Bhagavad Gita and these concepts have been misinterpreted in the present day. Attachment is a part of nature's design. According to the Vedas, we are all interconnected in this universe and we have an immense capacity to love and nurture others. The concept of वसुदैव कुटुंबकं emphasises on togetherness and viewing family as a foundational source of empowerment and joy. Swami Vivekananda highlighted that the central idea of Vedanta lies is oneness. Detachment is not about being away from people and being emotionless; rather, it is about experiencing and perceiving things as they truly are without any judgements and letting go of things without holding on to them. Detachment is the realization that we are the captain of our souls and masters of our emotions.

*Family Apgar Questionnaire was developed by Smilkstein et al. in 1982. The link has been attached in the references.

In Srimad Bhagavad Gita, Lord Krishna has brought out the importance of detachment in the 19th verse of the third chapter (Karma Yoga).

तस्मादसक्तः सततं कार्यं कर्म समाचर ।

असक्तो ह्याचरन्कर्म परमाप्नोति पूरुषः ॥ (SBG III.19)

Meaning: Therefore, constantly perform your obligatory duty without attachment as by performing duty without attachment, man obtains the supreme.

ध्यायतो विषयान्पुंसः सङ्गस्तेषूपजायते ।

सङ्गात्सञ्जायते कामः कामात्क्रोधोऽभिजायते ॥ (SBG II.62)

Meaning: The man dwelling on sense objects develops attachment for them; it springs up desire, and desire (unfulfilled) bursts into anger.

Love should have no preconditions and it should not have control over the other person and dictate their life. It is the innate quality of every parent to love their children with expectations but ideal parenting would be to love them without preconditions and discharge their duty by grooming their children inculcating good values which will shape them to be good citizens.

Srimad Bhagavad Gita emphasizes that it is important for the parents to inculcate their children with self-discipline and guide them to be a master over their senses as it brings in them the sense of divinity. The 16th chapter of Srimad Bhagavad Gita focuses on important values that should be instilled in the children.

भवन्ति सम्पदं दैवीमभिजातस्य भारत ॥ (SBG XVI.1-3)

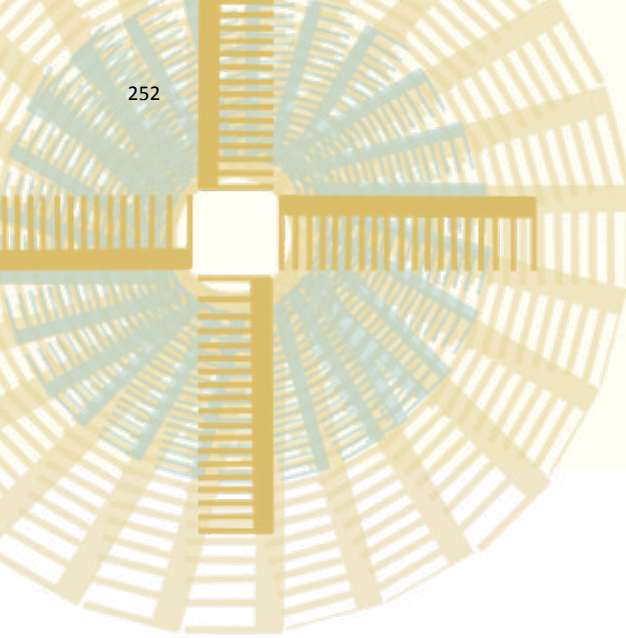
The values include fearlessness, purity of heart, steadfastness in knowledge and yoga, study of scriptures, austerity, straightforwardness, non-violence, truth, absence of anger, renunciation, serenity, compassion, gentleness, modesty, absence of fickleness, vigour, forgiveness, fortitude, purity and absence of hatred and pride. Lord Krishna mentions that these values belong to those who are pious. It is the responsibility of the parents to be ideal role models for their children to follow.

They should encourage and guide their children to introspect and find the truest expression of themselves. To ensure that the family boat is on keel, individuals should master their senses and control their desires so that they are at peace within themselves which in turn ensures that they are at peace with the society and exude family values.

In the present study, the results showed a significant shift in values between Gen X and Gen Z. Gen X held the position of a highly functional family while Gen Z held the position of moderately dysfunctional and dysfunctional families. The sample belonging to Gen X were more inclined towards upholding family values while Gen Z seemed to be influenced by western values and were less inclined towards the idea of family values. The study also showed Gen Z's profound tendency in questioning the authority of traditional values by demanding empirical results and on the other hand Generation X's inability to go in accordance with changing times and its influence on daily life.

The results suggested that it may be because the priorities have changed in tune with modern times in tandem with the mad race against nature. This can be reasoned with the concept of chronosystem (Urie Bronfenbrenner, 1979). In this context, chronosystem includes life transitions, environmental changes, technological advancements and historical events that occurred during the development of Gen Z that contributed to how they perceive family and its values. In Gen X the world focuses on values and humanity where the word "We" has more significance while in Gen Z the orientation is towards materialism where "Me" supersedes "We" and it gains the priority.

Srimad Bhagavad Gita emphasises on the fact that self-knowledge gained by divine grace alone can equip an individual to overcome any crisis. It also highlights on the discretionary powers of an individual to choose between duty and non-duty and bondage and liberation. Life always bristles with challenges of varying magnitude and individuals solve them with their discernment and ability but Srimad Bhagavad Gita teaches us that ultimately achieving the imminent sense of divinity and seeking enlightenment can only probe individuals into the mystery of life and tide over the difficulty of the challenges.

India's global representation is rooted in the idea of 'unity in diversity', contemplative of the wide collection of cultures and civilizations that remains to attract many across the world. The soft power rootlets move very deep. Appraisals of India's soft power draw traditional, religious, ethnolinguistic, and constructive relations with other nations. Everything as a component of the Indian culture was fascinating to the outside world. India dedicated itself to gaining internationally through commerce and statecraft, apart from "soft" power. Upanishads delivered the notion of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' to the world and to India. Renowned ancient Indian philosopher, Chanakya's maneuvering to gain over adjacent powers by settlement and non-aggression arrangement and grants also demonstrate the significance of soft power in ancient Indian statecraft.

India has a vibrant and traditional history that has given rise to several academicians, intellectuals, and scholars who have committed to the

The ancient universities of India were the most prominent centers of cultural synergy and soft power, which drew a great number of scholars and learners from different parts of the world. The soft power of India has scattered in her extensive social and civilization heritage over millennia, which manifests that her purposes of secularism, liberalism, and inclusiveness of cultures are more critical in today's restless society. A concrete experience of south-south collaboration and long-held solidarity with developing nations is an added element of Indian soft power in various sections of the world. The Gandhian concepts of non-violence, Nehru's Five Postulates of Panchsheel (Peaceful Coexistence), and the globally supported Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) during the cold war made an important factor in global associations.

INDIA PERCEIVED AS A PROMOTER OF CULTURE, DIALOGUE AND SYNERGY

Jawaharlal Nehru, India's first Prime Minister was assured that the country was fastened to perform a great and benevolent share in foreign affairs. India has been perceived as a promoter of culture, dialogue, and synergy in the continuation of global politics. The religious leader of the Tibetans, his holiness Dalai Lama explained, "India's great tradition of religious tolerance can be a role model for the entire world". With the arrival of liberalization and globalization of the economy, the interlacing among nations across the world has increased. The soft power has now been graced as the essential factor of the overall power of a nation. It can increase the adhesion and the determination of the people in a domain and the capability to shape the foreign relations of a nation. Soft power has also become a piece of crucial equipment in determining India's foreign policy and strategic decisions.

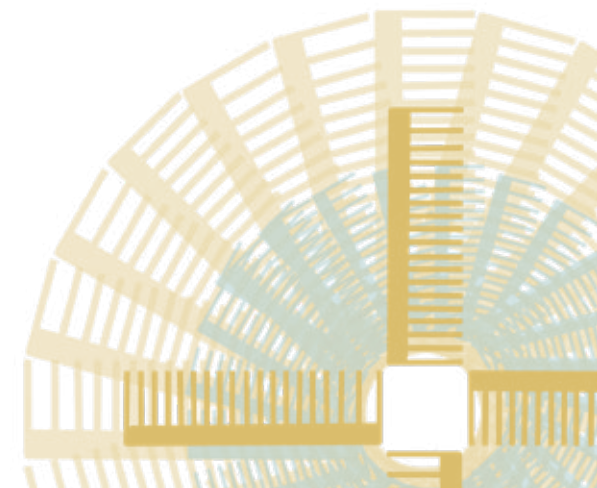

CONCLUSION

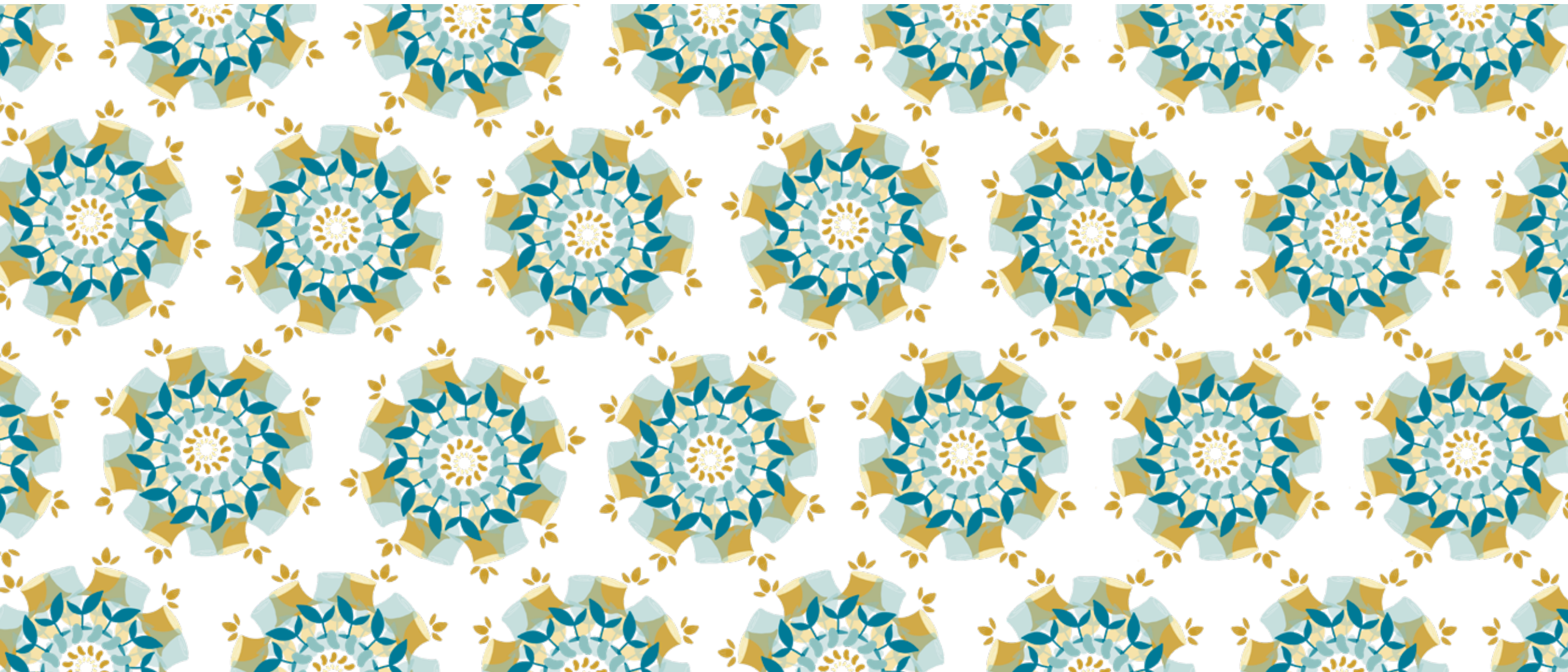

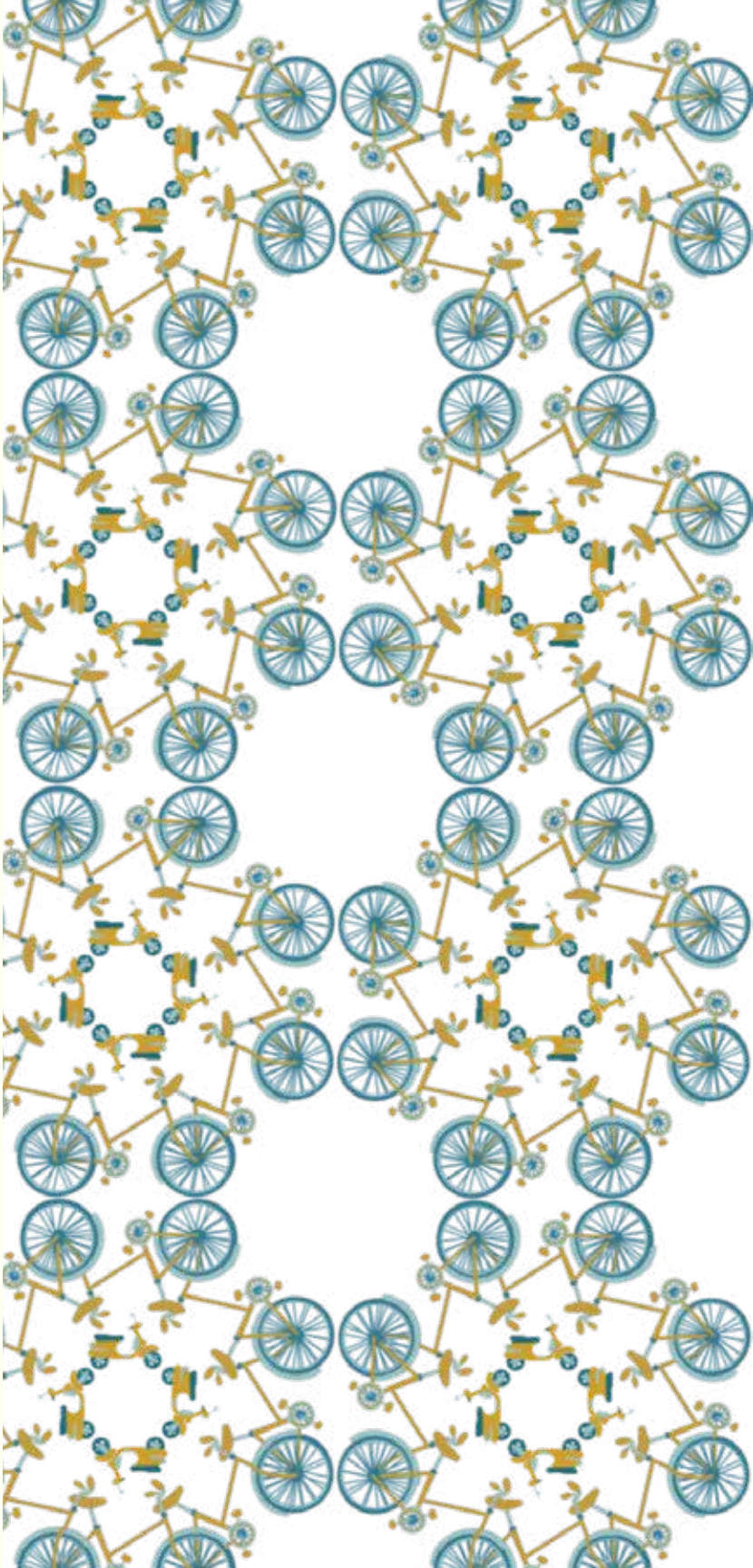

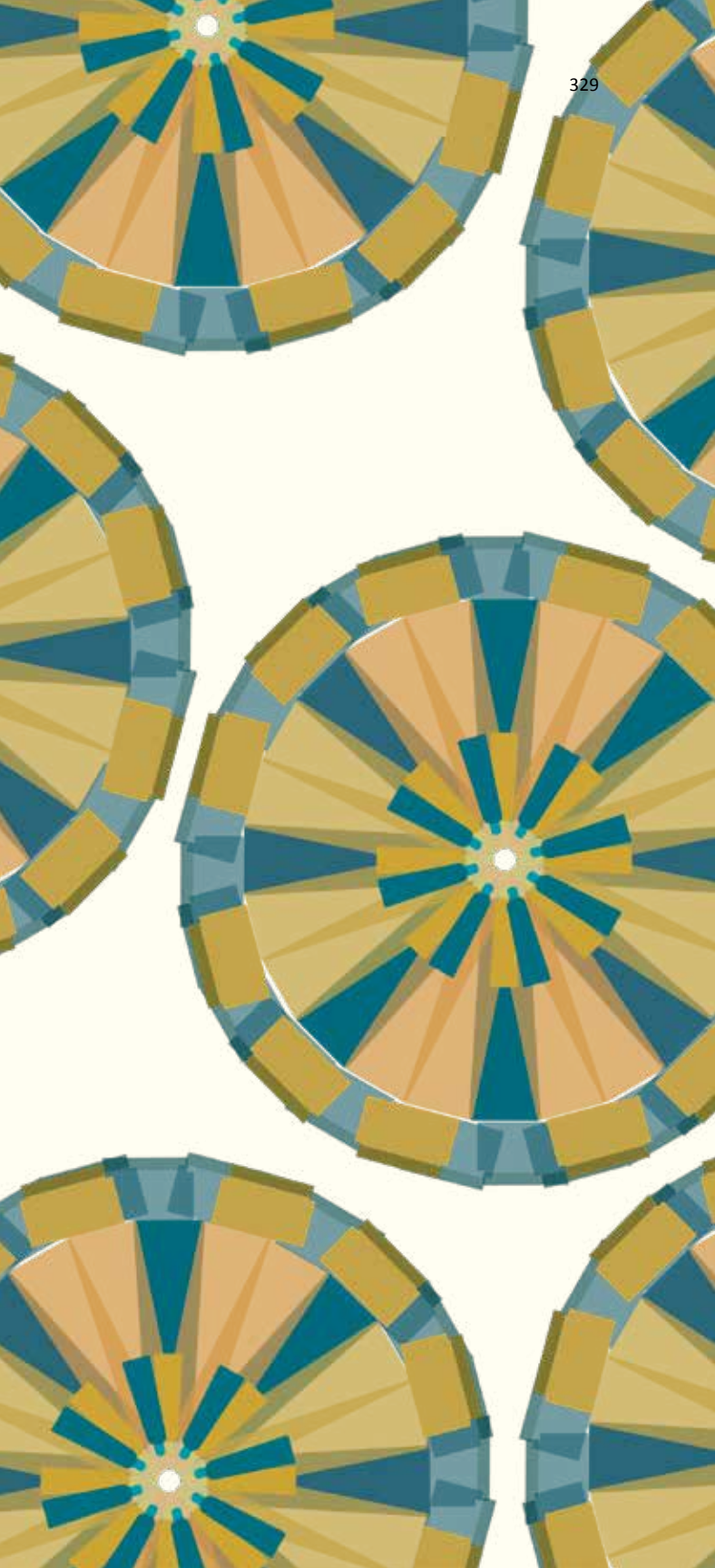
