COMMUNITY OUTREACH OF PMGDISHA THROUGH FOLK MEDIA IN THIRUPACHUR VILLAGE, THIRUVALLUR DISTRICT ON 4th JULY 2017

The Common Service Centre (CSC) at Stella Maris College Extension Project Centre (SMCEPC) had already inaugurated the PMGDISHA on 9th June 2017 at a simple ceremony. Sr Susan Matheikal, V.L.E. and Dr. K. Sundari , Program Coordinator decided to have a "Community Outreach program through folk media" on 4th July 2017 at the beginning of the academic year. Nearly 27 villages surround SMCEPC and therefore women and children were identified as the target groups for the PMGDISHA training programs through folk media. Folk dance, music and theatre are simple in content and have the emotive reach and impact on the rural population.

The students of the National Service Scheme (NSS) were trained in folk media: folk dance, folk music and folk theatre by Dr.P.Kumaragurudasan, Training Officer, State Resource Centre of the Government of India at Taramani, Chennai after researching the website of PMGDISHA. He was one of the earliest performing artist to obtain a Ph.D. in folk media. The Community Hall at Thirupachur near Kotiyur Middle school was the venue and over 200 enthusiastic children and 50 motivated women from Self Help Groups (SHG's) attended the program.

Ms. Elizabeth, alumna (Mathematics) and Branch Manager of Indian Bank was the Chief Guest and she readily agreed to open accounts for the women of the village. The Headmistress of Kotiyu Middle School encouraged all the eligible children to enroll in PMGDISHA at CSC-TVL.
