Honourable CM of Tamil Nadu Thiru M.K. Stalin Attends Finale of Stella Maris College 75th Jubilee Celebrations

Chennai, 25 May 2022: In honour of the 75th jubilee year of Stella Maris College (Autonomous) the celebrations got off to a start on Independence Day 2021, with the release of postcards with pictorial representations of iconic buildings on campus. The Sapphirus Cognitio Talks Series was organised for students and faculty wherein experts from industry, academia, research institutions and the corporate organisations were held over March to May 2022. A grand finale on this day marked ten months of commemorative events which was graced by the presence of the Honourable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Thiru. M.K. Stalin.
