FLOOD RELIEF

Description of Programme / Activity:

Soon after the Chennai floods in the month of December 2015, SMCDRIVE came to the rescue of many marginalized people who were affected by the floods in the nearby communities of the College, namely Thiruvikakudiirupu, M.K.RadhaNagar, GangaikaraiPuram, S.S.Puram, Nakeeran Nagar, and MKR Nagar. Immediately after College reopened, the relief work was started by the BSW students and the II MSW field work students placed at SMCDRIVE networked with Chennai Volunteers and personally visited the nearby flood-affected communities. A need-based assessment survey was then carried out. Based on their needs, people who had an identity proof i.e. either a Ration card /Aadhar card/Voters Id, were identified and selected. Tokens specifying the date and time to collect the relief materials were given to them. This helped in a fair distribution of relief materials without disruptive overcrowding. Later, about 100 people who did not have any identity proof were also selected, based on their immediate needs and were also given relief materials. This distribution of relief materials was organized at SMCDRIVE-Shanthi Bhavan premises of the college in a well-organized manner on 22.12.2015 and 23.12.2015.
