

Activities of SCEED: 2019-2020

1. Workshops and Training Sessions:

a) IPR Workshop:

A two-day State Level Technical Workshop on IPR was conducted in association with the Patent Information Centre, Tamilnadu State Council for Science and Technology, Govt. of Tamil Nadu, Chennai, catalysed and supported by Department of Science And Technology, Govt. of India on November11 & 12, 2019 at Stella Maris College, Chennai. The aim of the workshop was to impart knowledge on IPR and understand the process of IP protection and Patent system in India The participants were from diverse backgrounds, ranging from faculty members and research scholars to students of both under-graduate and post-graduate levels. About 110 participants befitted from the workshop

d) Training Workshop on Econometrics:



e) Faculty Development Programmes (during the peiod April – July 2020) :

Besides the above, the Centre has organised Webinars at the National and International levels of Faculty Development Programmes. The lockdown period was utilised for enhancing the knowledge capital and also trained the faculty to face the challenges of online teaching and communication. The webinars covered various aspects of quality in higher education and also included briefings on NAAC accreditation. The topics included Essential Technology Skills for Online Teaching, Learning and Assessment, 3D Printing, Virtual Reality and Augmented Reality, Strategies for online classes such as Google meet / Google class etc, Enhancing research capacities through scientific thinking, manuscript writing, ethical practices, preparation of grant proposals, publishing and also training in open. Soft wares. The participants were faculty from other HEIs and also from the mentee institutions under the Paramarsh Scheme.

The Stella Centre for Effective Education and Development (SCEED) and IQAC jointly coordinate this programme.

The college constituted a Standing committee and assigned a mentor for each college along with a pool of experts who shared their knowledge and facilitated the smooth implementation of the programme.

The team closely works with the six Mentee Institutions and conducts regular consultation meetings, Training sessions and workshops.

To achieve the envisaged benefits of enhancement of overall quality of the mentee institutions and facilitate the sharing of knowledge, information and opportunities, the members of Paramarsh provided inputs as resource persons, organised Faculty Development Programmes and sessions on topics ranging from Teaching Learning Evaluation, Academic Audit, Documentation, Student Support Services, Infrastructure, avenues for research augmentation, building of faculty profile etc.

The team from the mentor institution visited the mentee institutions to gain knowledge on the profile of the college and present status of the institution.

The initial programmes were done commonly for all the colleges highlighting the importance, relevance and the process of NAAC Accreditation.

After due ground assessment of the potential areas of improvement for each college, individual programmes catering to their needs for quality enhancement in specific areas are being conducted depending on their strengths and challenges.

The sessions/training programmes focused on the various criteria of the NAAC accreditation process, Standard Operating Procedures and Documentation and validation. The positive response from the mentee institutions is encouraging and hopeful

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**4.** Eco – Initiatives: In keeping with the policies of the college towards ecological justice and sustainable development an Energy Audit and Green Audit of the Campus was successfully conducted by NIN Energy India Pvt Limited. The energy conservation options of various energy sources like Electricity, gas, Fuel oil etc. was documented and recommendations were suggested for reducing the Energy Consumption. The audit included Electrical Distribution System, Lighting System, Heating, Ventilation & Air-Conditioning System, Water Pumping System, Motor Load Survey and Energy Monitoring & Environmental impact.
