

Stella Maris College, a Catholic institution of higher education for women, is under the management of the Society of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary. "Stella Maris" in Latin means "Star of the Sea". "Truth and Charity" is the motto of the College. The College emblem is a ship sailing on stormy waters, led on by a star.

Begun in a small one-storey building on 15 August 1947 with an enrolment of 32 students, the College has at present nearly 5000 students on its magnificent campus "The Cloisters" on Cathedral Road, Chennai.

The College became autonomous in 1987 and now has 19 undergraduate and 12 postgraduate programmes. Stella Maris College is a minority institution that provides higher education in a Christian atmosphere for deserving students, especially those belonging to the Catholic community. Others are also admitted irrespective of caste and creed and their rights of conscience are respected. Besides, the College commits itself to serve the economically weak, socially backward, and needy students.

The vision of the College is to build a vibrant and inclusive learning community in a culture

of excellence sustained by a sound value system that promotes responsible citizenship and effects social change.

The mission of the College is to empower young women to face the challenges of life with courage and commitment, to be builders of a humane and just society, and to promote a learning community in which all, especially those from less privileged backgrounds, feel part of the collaborative, high quality educational process which is value-based and leads to holistic growth.

In 2000, the College was accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council and awarded Five Star Status. In 2008, the College was reaccredited and was awarded an A grade with a CGPA of 3.57 on a 4 point scale. In 2013, the College was reaccredited and was awarded an A grade with a CGPA of 3.68 on a 4 point scale.

In 2016, the College was accorded the status of College with Potential for Excellence. Also, the College was conferred the title "Pride of the Catholic Church" by the Catholic Bishops Conference of India, Office of Education and Culture.

video systems, and automated lighting control systems using wireless mesh technology in January 2018. A gym has been set up on campus, with cardio and strength-building equipment installed in January 2018. An exclusive Strength Room will be opened soon.

A Safe Food Festival, organised to mark the tenth year of reStore, was held on campus on 17 and 18 February 2018. It showcased the benefits of eating traditional food and staying connected to the land. An organic farming initiative has been progressing on campus under the direction of Dr. Sundari Krishnamurthy, Director, SMCNC, and Dr. Sathyabama, Assistant Professor, Department

of Botany. Our commitment to environmental sustenance continues to grow and the Stella Greenhouse, funded by the Rotary Club of Madras East and Dr. Priscilla Jebakumari, former Vice-Principal, was inaugurated on 11 October 2017.

The Open Air Theatre was the scene of several events this year. Founder's Day was held on 17 November 2017, with a cultural feast celebrating the life and works of Blessed Mary of the Passion. A message, focussing on her legacy was delivered by Sr. Stella Balthazar of the Ooty Province.

Graduation Day was held on 23 September 2017. The chief guest was Thiru. Sunil Paliwal

IAS. Departmental activities have been many and varied. The Social Work Students' Forum, Unnathi, in association with the NGO, Thozhamai, organised a programme in which UNICEF's Global Report on Children in a Digital World was released by Mr. Job Zachariah, Chief of UNICEF Office for Tamil Nadu and Kerala, and Ms. M. P. Nirmala, IAS, Chairperson, Tamil Nadu Commission for Protection of Child Rights, on 11 December 2017.

The Department of Botany conducted Go Green, a series of intradepartmental and interdepartmental competitions on a wide variety of popular eco-related themes like Think Green, Reduce, Recycle and Reuse all through the academic year. Students of the Department of Zoology undertook a study of butterflies on campus from 16 to 19 February 2018 and were able to document 31 species of butterflies.

Value added certificate courses are offered by several departments to students who wish to avail of additional credits. Students who passed the NPTEL online course examinations also received extra credits.

Dr. Karen Kayser, Dr. Renato/La Rocca Chair of Oncology, University of Louisville, Kent School of Social Work, and Ms. Cynthia Dettman of the University of New Mexico, USA, both Fulbright Scholars, are teaching courses in the Department of Social Work.

Serving the community is a crucial part of our mission and all the community-based programmes and projects we saw on campus this year are a testimony to our commitment to social justice and transformation. The Departments of Public Relations and Sociology, in collaboration with Earth Smiles, an NGO working for environmental welfare, steered a campaign called "Re-Green Chennai" in October 2017.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College organised training programmes for faculty geared towards enhancing their skills as facilitators as well as developing new pedagogies. An Internal Audit Course on ISO 9001:2015 was organised by the IQAC, in partnership with DNV GL, a Norwegian based organisation on 7, 8 and 11 September 2017. The Cell also organised a workshop on Student-centered Teaching and a Train the Trainers programme with Dr. Cynthia Dettman as the resource person.

SMCDRIVE conducted an Art and Mental



Health Workshop, a one-day Capacity Building Programme for NGO Personnel, and a Children's Day programme for children living with HIV from 26 to 29 April 2017.

Representatives from the Women's Development Corporation oriented around 150 women on Self-help Group formation on 12 September 2017.

The PMGDISHA sanctioned by the Government of India was inaugurated on 9 June 2017 at the Common Service Centre at SMCEPC. The first batch of 20 village health nurses underwent digital training in August 2017. The Campus Ministry, under the leadership of Sr. Sundari fmm, organised retreats and workshops for students. An orientation session was also organised for parents of first year students.

The NSS and YRC units have many achievements to their credit. The units won the Dr. Radhakrishnan Rolling Trophy for mobilising the maximum number of blood donors among the city's women's colleges for the eighth consecutive year, in September 2017. To commemorate World AIDS Day, the NSS and YRC unit, in collaboration with the Y. R. Gaitonde Centre for AIDS Research and Education, organised a sensitisation programme along with representatives from Denmark. Around eighty volunteers participated in a rally on World Sight Day to encourage eye donation. The NSS Annual rural camp with the theme Healthy Youth for Healthy India was organised in Thirupachur, Thiruvallur District, from 17 to

23 December 2017.

The NCC cadets have performed excellently in various areas of their involvement. Senior Cadet Captain Bhoomika R.S. was selected to be the Indian Ambassador to Nepal through the Youth Exchange Programme from 26 January to 26 February 2018. Several of the NCC cadets were selected to participate in events at the national level. Here are some outstanding cadets: Cadet Warrant Officer Betcy Theodore, third year Mathematics, Senior Under Officer Mercy Amala Josephine M., third year Mathematics, Naval Cadets Sameetha Reena L. second year Physics and NCC Cadet Akshaya, Department of Chemistry.

We have excelled in sports and games this year as well. Our College teams secured the Winner's title at Madras University's intercollegiate tournaments in basketball, chess, table tennis and tennis. Forty-seven students from our College were selected to represent the Madras University B Zone, twelve students were selected to represent the Madras University and eleven students were selected to represent Tamil Nadu at various sporting events. The College Tennis Team secured the Winner's title at the National Level Intercollegiate Tournament organised by MOP Vaishnav College. Our College Basketball team won the Winner's title at the National Level Intercollegiate Tournament organised by SSN College. At the National Level Intercollegiate Tournament organised by VIT, Chennai, our College table tennis team secured the Winner's title.

In Athletics, N. Arthi, II B. Com, secured the gold medal in 100 metres at the South Asian Youth Games Golden Cup held at Phuentsholing, Bhutan. In Roller Skating, Subi Suvetha, II B.A. Economics, secured the 16th position in the World Championship held at Nanjing, China. In the 55th National Roller Skating Championship held at Chennai, Subi Suvetha secured the gold medal in 100 metres and the silver medal in 300 metres relay and Pranamya Rao, II B.A. Sociology, secured the gold medal in Solo Dance. Janvi Rathore, II BBA, won the gold medal at the all India Interuniversity Squash Tournament.R. Vinitha of second year B.A. Sociology was part of the Madras University cricket team which secured the gold medal.

The Students' Union 2017–18 took office in June 2017. In addition to the annual events, the Students' Union introduced some new initiatives. Their social theme was represented by the acronym LEAD: Learn, Empower, Appreciate, Discover. The Union introduced Ramzan celebrations for the first time on campus. They also hosted the biggest intracollegiate cultural event this year on the theme "Lights, Camera, Action—Behind the Scenes".

The Pathway Programme aims to help students from the less privileged sections of society gain access to employment opportunities, develop confidence, and communicate in English. Pathway students in the final year of their study in College, in collaboration with the Career Guidance Cell,



underwent a one-hundred-hour programme organised by the Mahindra Pride School on interpersonal communication and presentation skills. The trainees attended a job fair organised at JBAS College and twenty of them have been shortlisted for employment in companies such as WIPRO, TCS and QUATRO. The final year students enrolled in the Pathway Programme were also given pre-recruitment training in group discussion, CV writing, aptitude test and interview techniques by the Career Guidance Cell.

This academic year, 122 Student Seekers and 23 Student Helpers in Shift I and 102 Student Seekers and 16 Student Helpers in Shift II were enrolled in the Language Partnership Programme, a peer-teaching programme in English Language Skills for first year students. Seven students performed exceedingly well in the examination conducted at the end of the first semester and were exempted from the programme.

Under the able guidance of Dr. Sr. Helen Vincent fmm, former Principal of the College and Director, English Language and Life Skills, fifteen students enrolled for the English Language and Life Skills Certificate Course. A total of 1769 students received scholarships

worth Rs 1,06,36,112 this year.

Six-hundred students registered with the Career Guidance Cell for campus placements this academic year. Campus recruitment started in August 2017 with Deloitte, Ernst and Young, Goldman Sachs, Google, and others holding interviews on campus. Second year undergraduate students were selected for internship programmes with them.

Manisha Jovitha, III B.Sc.Mathematics, was awarded a scholarship to attend a Leadership Conference in Florida. Agnella Nikitha, III B.Sc. Mathematics, was selected to attend a Senior Managers Conference in the Middle East.

As we forge ahead, we reaffirm our commitment to our vision and the continuing search for truth. We repose our trust in the Almighty who guides us every step of the way. As I conclude this report, I thank God Almighty for accompanying us through this eventful journey. I place on record my gratitude to the many organisations, especially the University Grants Commission, the Department of Biotechnology and the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, the NAAC, the Department of Higher Education, Government of Tamil Nadu, the University of Madras, the United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia, and the International Federation of Catholic Universities, for their support and encouragement.

My special thanks to Sr. Leena D'Souza, Provincial, and to all my FMM Sisters at the Stella Maris Convent. I extend my gratitude to







In Memoriam






Dr. Hannah John joined the Department of Zoology in the year 1975 and served the institution for two decades. She retired from service in 1996. She was one of the few Doctorate Degree holders at SMC in her time. She was a teacher par excellence and fondly remembered by her students as a "walking encyclopaedia". She was a very highly motivated teacher reaching out to all her students. Deeply involved in the organisation of all departmental activities, she went to great lengths to inculcate the love of the environment by arranging for field trips for both faculty and students.

Dr. Hannah John was a world-renowned arachnologist. Her work on jumping spiders has been highly commended. She spent a couple of years in Ruhr University, Germany, researching Collembolans in the soil ecosystem. She also had the unique distinction of having a spider and mite species named after her.

Dr. Hannah John's interests ranged from love for animals to cooking and gardening. She was the health index of the Department, waxing eloquent on different healthy and unhealthy foods. She was always true to her calling as a teacher and mentor and was a person of integrity. Dr. Hannah passed away on 9 March 2018. The Stella Maris College community, and the Department of Zoology, in particular, is ever grateful to Dr. Hannah John for the dedication and commitment with which she served the institution.

College Activities



National Service Scheme & Youth Red Cross

Library

The College library is an important hub of campus life. The Stella Maris College Library underwent a major upgradation in technology with the introduction of the Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) system, one of the latest technologies used in library theft detection systems. It also makes circulation services and inventory control quicker and more accurate.

The Library has a collection of over 1,08,856 print books and 102 print journals and also subscribes to online resources like EBSCO, Questia and N-list and AEA journals. A new webpage for the Library is also available on the College website which showcases all the salient services and facilities offered in the Library.

The Library staff organised many programmes this academic year, beginning with the orientation programme for the first year undergraduate and postgraduate students. On 21 September 2017, the book exhibition, an annual event, was organised by the Library. The American Library Membership Drive was organised on 4 October 2017. On 5 October 2017, the EBSCO training manager was on campus to train all the first-year postgraduate students to use the EBSCO Journal database effectively and efficiently. Stella Maris College was listed as one of the top ten users of the N-list programme (INFLIBNET) for the fourth consecutive year.

As our College has established a local chapter with Indian Institute of Technology, Madras for the NPTEL Programme, this year witnessed a rise in the students taking the NPTEL online certification examination. One hundred and eighteen students passed the examination for the period March-October 2017 with five toppers from our College. Our College was listed in the active top 100 Colleges out of more than 1600 local chapters. M. Mahalakshmi, Librarian, was acknowledged as an active SPOC for the period July-December 2017 for the NPTEL Programme. An interactive "Meet the Author" session with Ms. Nish Amarnath, an alumna and author of the book Victims for Sale, was organised jointly with the Public Relations Office on 23 February 2018. The Library had put on a special display of her books and articles. An audio-visual presentation made on the book was applauded by all.

In keeping with the College's commitment in creating an inclusive atmosphere on campus, the visually challenged students were given handson training in the use of basic computer skills in the Library for ten days.

Stellarchives

Stellarchives has had a busy semester filled with events and activities: growth in materials collected and preserved, visits of distinguished persons, extensive use of the Archives for study and research, designing of a standard cover page for departmental journals of the College and consultancy work by the archivist.

The annual meeting of the departmental representatives of the Stellarchives was held on 12 July 2017. Sr. Susan, fmm, Secretary of the College, stressed the need to record the birth, growth and history of the College because of

its unique nature and its cultural heritage. While presenting the updates, Ms Gita Balachandran, Archivist, highlighted the significance of preserving photographs and manuscripts relating to the visits of eminent personalities such as Shri A. L. Mudaliar to Stella Maris College. She informed the group that as decided at the previous meeting, class photographs were being collected and tagged. This herculean task, it is hoped, will be taken forward at the next Alumnae Meet in which all the participants would be engaged in filling up the missing names of their classmates and the Department that completes



the greatest number could be acknowledged and rewarded.

Sr. Nirmala, member of the Stellarchives team, spoke about a few good practices adopted at the archives of Providence Methodist University, Taiwan, a Catholic University, which she had visited during the UBCHEA Fellows Programme. A web portal of Stellarchives is being planned to provide digital access to the collection of photographs, coins and stamps. A policy manual has been prepared and awaits the approval of the Management. The possibility of cloud computing, very essential for alternative methods of preservation, is being explored. Networking with other archives in the country and abroad is envisaged to enhance efficiency and accessibility. A visit has been planned to the archives in the Franciscan Generalate in Rome in order to share expertise, as also a short internship at the archives of KU Leuven, a Catholic University in Belgium. Since this year marks the 650th year of the Hungarian Chapel in Aachen, Germany where Sr. Edith Tömöry's doctoral thesis is being discussed, a visit to Germany would be mutually beneficial.

Chitra, Principal, Sri Ramakrishna College of Arts and Science for Women, Coimbatore.

Stellarchives has been actively engaged in preserving the history and heritage of the College both scientifically and systematically. The College has now become a trendsetter in this area with many colleges in the city and the country following suit.

Stella Maris College Pathway Programme

The Stella Maris College Pathway Programme funded by the UGC Equal Opportunities Centre aims to help students from the less privileged sections of society to access employment opportunities which could help them move up the social ladder.

The Stella Maris College Pathway Programme for the academic year 2017–2018 began with a Bridge Course for first year undergraduate students prior to the commencing of their degree programme. The Course was conducted

for 80 students from 6 to 11 June 2017. The resource persons for the first five days were trainers in Life Skills—Prof. John A. Joseph, Ms. Vijayanthi, Dr. Nirmala, and Ms. Sabitha. On 11 June 2017, Mahindra Pride School Volunteers, Ms. Sonia and Ms. Anandhi, conducted training sessions. This programme was organised to help students achieve an easy transition from school to college, develop self-confidence and self-esteem, and communicate in English. Each day of the programme began with a warm-up session conducted by the office bearers of the Students'

Union 2017–18. The student volunteers and the office bearers of the Students' Union engaged all the first year students through action songs and games.

In collaboration with the Career Guidance Cell of the College, the third year Pathway students were trained by Mahindra Pride School off-campus 100 hour programme in collaboration with the Career Guidance Cell of the college on interpersonal, communication and presentation skills by a trainer, Ms. Wyceline, from November 2017 to February 2018. The trained students attended the Job Fair organised at SIET College on 10 February 2018. Twenty of the Pathway students have been selected for TCS, WIPRO, QUATRO and Aegis Healthcare Pvt. Ltd.

In collaboration with the Career Guidance Cell of the College, the second year students of both Shift I and Shift II were given an orientation by Ms. Anandhi and Ms. Wyceline of Mahindra Pride School. Employability training will be conducted next year on campus for a period of 40 to 80 hours for 40 students who had registered after the orientation. The third year Pathway Students were given pre-recruitment training in Group Discussion, CV writing, Aptitude Test and Interview Techniques by the Career Guidance Cell of the College in collaboration with Ms. Vyjayanthi, Trainer in Life Skills on 22 and 23 February 2018.

Language Partnership Programme

The Language Partnership Programme (LPP), one of the best practices of the College that facilitates peer teaching amongst the student community, was conducted every day in the month of July and twice a week from August onwards. This academic year, 122 Student Seekers and 23 Student Helpers in Shift I and 102 Student Seekers and 16 Student Helpers in Shift II were enrolled in LPP. The members of LPP, grouped as Student Helpers and Student Seekers, are together called Language Partners.

The second year undergraduate students, who volunteered to be Helpers, were administered a diagnostic test to gauge their proficiency in the English language. The faculty of the English Department conducted a two-week long training programme and also prepared the manual for the Language Partners. The Helpers were entrusted with a group of 10 to 15 Seekers. Helpers who fulfilled the minimum requirement of 75% attendance earned an extra credit each semester. As a result of attending LPP classes, some Seekers showed considerable improvement in their English language skills, which was reflected in their performance in the end-semester examination.

English Language & Life Skills Programme

This programme aims at equipping students with English language communication and life skills. The 2017–18 batch had 15 students, including three FMM sisters from Vietnam. Most of the other students were from Tamil medium schools and this programme provided them an opportunity to enter mainstream college in the forthcoming academic year.

The programme was inaugurated on 3 July 2017 with the blessings of Dr. Sr. Helen Vincent, Director, ELLS and the Principal Dr. Sr. Jasintha

Quadras. The programme focusses on English language skills, life skills, social awareness and basic computer skills. The language skills consisted of spoken/functional English, grammar, comprehension and writing skills with extensive usage of the Language Lab. Life skills classes were interactive and activity-based and aimed at creating self-awareness and building self-esteem and self-confidence in the students. The students were also provided lessons on stress management, time management, effective communication, interpersonal relationships, thinking skills, and

skills to cope with the challenges in life. The social awareness classes explored current issues which impact the individual and the society, while the computer skills classes included an exposure to MS Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Publisher, which helped the students become adept at creating brochures and presentations.

Besides attending regular classes, the students enthusiastically celebrated Teachers' Day on 5 September 2017 and Christmas on 19 December 2017. The students also participated in a postermaking competition on "The Current Issues Faced by Today's Women" on 13 February 2018. Ms. Gita Balachandran organised a field trip for the students to Yelagari from 16 to 19 January 2018. During the trip, they attended a workshop on personal, interpersonal and leadership skills with a focus on team synergy. They also attended a half-day computer lab session on PhotoShop at the Don Bosco IT College. This trip helped the students form strong bonds of friendship, besides honing their skills.

The valedictory on 6 April 2018 was the crowning moment for their efforts as they shared, in English, what they had learnt during the programme. They also received awards, certificates and gifts. This was a joyous occasion for both the teachers as well as the students.

Centre for Research in Science & Technology

The Department of Science and Technology–Fund for the Improvement of Science and Technology, (DST–FIST) Instrumentation Centre was inaugurated at the CRIST Lab in Stella Maris College on 11 August 2017 by Dr. B. Chandrasekaran, Director, CSIR–CLRI, Chennai. Dr. Mary Terry, DST–FIST co-ordinator, gave an overview of the facilities available at the Instrumentation Centre.

A fund of nearly one crore rupees was sanctioned to the College by the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India under the DST-FIST Programme-2015 Level '0', to purchase high-end sophisticated instruments, software and books. The Centre now houses

sophisticated equipment which include Solid UV-Vis Spectrophotometer, ATR- FTIR Spectrophotometer, HPLC, Gel-Doc Molecular Imager, Orbital Shaker, Probe Sonicator, Electrochemical Workstation and two software: Schrodinger and MATLAB. These facilities will be made available to students and research scholars of all colleges and universities in order to ignite scientific curiosity in the minds of future scientists. Dr. Mary Terry, (Administrative Director, CRIST) and Ms. Elizabeth Varghese (Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry) co-ordinated a three-month Certificate Course on "Exploring Nanoscience—Synthesis and Characterisation of Nanoparticles" in collaboration with the DST Unit of Nanoscience and Thematic Unit of

Excellence, IIT Madras, from November 2017 to January 2018. This course was attended by 42 undergraduate students from the Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology. It included lectures, demonstrations and a laboratory visit to the DST Unit of Nanoscience and Thematic Unit of Excellence, IIT Madras, A. series of lectures held at CRIST included eminent speakers: Ms. Rini Ravindranath, (Department of Chemistry, National Taiwan University, Taipei, Taiwan), Prof. C. Vijayan (Professor, Department of Physics, IIT Madras), Dr. M. Saroja Devi (Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry, Anna University), and Dr. Cynthia Jemima Swarnavalli G. (Head, Department of Chemistry, Women's Christian College) and research scholars from the

Department of Chemistry, Stella Maris College. Over these three months, students synthesised several nanoparticles (iron oxide, zinc oxide, manganese oxide, copper hydroxide, cuprous oxide, gold and silver nanoparticles) through both chemical methods and plant-based green synthesis, learned various characterisation techniques and submitted their original research findings in the form of a project report.

The educational visit to the DST Unit of Nanoscience and Thematic Unit of Excellence at IIT Madras enabled the students to learn about the latest characterisation techniques used in the field of Nanoscience.

Stella Maris International Centre for Multidisciplinary Research

The Stella Maris International Centre for Multidisciplinary Research is committed to promoting and facilitating research and collaboration to enhance the quality of education in the College. By implementing a three-pronged approach to research development—training in research, conducting research activities and encouraging increase in publications—the Centre aims to broaden and strengthen the existing research base.

Various training sessions addressed the need to increase the number of research publications and also helped faculty effectively synergise teaching with research. Research Capacity Building sessions were conducted by research experts such as Dr. Rita John, Department of Physics, University of Madras; Dr. Robinson, Head of the Mathematics Department, MCC; Dr. Kadambari, Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development; Prof. Victor Lois Anthuvan, Research Director, LIBA and Dr. Bharathi Harishankar, Head, Department

of Women's Studies, University of Madras, to mention a few.

The optional undergraduate research initiative was introduced this year to hone critical thinking and basic research skills. This resulted in the participation of 96 scholars who produced minor dissertations to earn extra credits.

An online research skills development course is in the process of being initiated as part of the training sessions.

The Technology Transfer Training programmes in research are supported through partnerships with IIT Madras, SRM University, LIBA and the Great Lakes Institute of Management, Chennai, Information Technology based at Le Tourneau University (LTU), Texas, and the Japan-based Company, Blackboard technology. As part of our advocacy research initiative, Ms. Gautami Tadimalla, Director of Life Again Foundation,

conducted a cancer awareness programme for the College community raising awareness on cancer prevention among young girls on 29 January 2018.

With regard to conducting international academic events, the Centre focussed on developing sustainable partnerships with foreign universities. The academic collaborations involve students and faculty exchange and training programmes, summer-study tours and research collaborations. This year saw our continued and successful partnership with the Liverpool Hope University (LHU), UK. The International MBA programme has moved successfully into its third year.

Dr. Atulya Nagar, Dean of Sciences, LHU, on invitation by the Research Centre conducted a one-day symposium on 27 July 2017 for the Department of Mathematics. Prof. Robinson, Head, Department of Mathematics, MCC, and Dr. T. Subramaniam also shared their expertise. On invitation from the LHU, a 16-member student delegation led by Dr. Vidya Srinivasan and Dr. Kalpana Jayaraman attended the Global Conference on Youth Leadership in the Hope University in June 2018.

The Trinity Western University (TWU), Canada and Stella Maris College jointly hosted the International conference, "Team Leadership: Collaboration, Management and Empowerment" on 16 November 2017. The departments of Social Work, Commerce and Sociology aligned with the Research Centre to organise the event. A student exchange programme has been initiated by Dr. Philip Laird, Provost, TWU ensuing which students of Sociology led by Dr. Maria Sasitha

participated in a study tour in the month of May 2018 in Canada.

Other high-profile visitors were Dr. Helen Pennant, Director of the Cambridge Trust and Ms. Jennifer Daubeny, Consul General, Canada, who addressed the students on international education. Prof. Alex Dimitrov, from the University of Melbourne, held discussions with the College on offering a B.Sc. blended programme for the Chemistry Department. Special talks by Prof. James Bunn and Dr. Michael Schlabra, Concordia College, New York were organised for the Department of Commerce. Professor Alan Clipperton, LTU, addressed the students of Computer Science, Psychology and Mathematics on the culture of technology advancement. Skype conferences/meetings/discussions/debates for students and faculty were organised by the Centre. Webair internet services were offered to facilitate discussions hosted by the Centre British Council, USIS, Nottingham with the Trent University, LHU, East London University, TWU, Canada, American National University, Virginia Tech University, US, to mention a few. A Stella Maris International Journal—SMIJAR has been initiated to promote and highlight the dissemination of research.

The Centre is thankful to funding agencies and donors, such as the UGC, the UBCHEA, IFCU, British Council and TAFE (Tractors and Farm Equipment), Chennai, for rendering support to research collaborations. TAFE has gifted the Jayshree Venkatraman Endowment to facilitate faculty development in areas of teaching and research.

Stella Maris College Extension Project Centre


The Stella Maris College Extension Project Centre at Thirupacchur Village launched its activities for the academic year 2017–2018 by inaugurating the Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan (PMGDISHA) in SMCEPC on 9 June 2017 in the presence of officials from the Common Services Centre eGovernance of India. Officials in the Departments of Health—both Medical Services and Public Health—along with those in the District Headquarters Hospital at Thiruvallur were requested to depute their staff for Digital Literacy Certification at SMCEPC. The DIG of Civil Supplies and Distribution was also invited to send his staff for training as

SMART cards were being issued for the Public Distribution System. A special developmental communication programme through folk music, dance and theatre was launched on 4 July 2017 to reach out to 250 children and 50 women of Self Help Groups and key officials in the village.

The digital training for the first batch of 20 Village Health Nurses was launched on 18 August 2017. As the Directorate of Public Health aims to train about 275 nurses through PMGDISHA. Subsequently the nurses were sent for various state level programmes in the community like dengue eradication, worm infestation control,

polio immunisation and so on. Crop insurance was distributed to 91 farmers by the District Collector, Ms. S. Sundaravalli, I.A.S at SMCEPC from 19 November to 30 November 2017.

Jeevan Praman Certificates were issued to 46 pensioners—Sisters, faculty and administrative staff at Stella Maris College on 19 and 20 December 2017. The Common Service Centre continues its extension of business and governmental services to the villagers and also helps them earn a steady revenue.

SMCNC began the activities for the academic year 2017–2018 by preparing and submitting a project proposal to launch the Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan (PMGDISHA), as per the directive from the Ministry of Communication and Information Technology, New Delhi. SMCNC also assisted SMCEPC to launch digital literacy training on 9 June 2017 at Thiruppacchur village, with CSC eGovernance officials Dr. Sundari K. prepared the affidavit and project proposal for recognition of SMCEPC as

a "Training Centre". She also set up meetings with the officials of various departments of the Government of Tamil Nadu such as Civil Supplies and Distribution, District Headquarters Hospital, Thiruvallur and the Joint Director and Deputy Director of Health Services and Medical Services respectively in the month of June 2017.

Dr. Sundari K. met with Dr. Kumaragurudasan, Training Officer, State Resource Centre, Government of India, and assisted in the

composition of folk songs, choreography of folk dances and direction of folk theatre on the theme of PMGDISHA. NSS students were enlisted to prepare a two-hour programme which was staged on 4 July 2017 at the Community Panchayat Hall, for 50 women of Self Help Groups and 250 children. The Branch Manager of Indian Bank and the Headmistress of Kotai Colony Secondary School were the chief guests at this outreach programme.

With the assistance of Dr. Satyabhama, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, SMCNC has developed a kitchen garden and a thematic herbal garden on campus. Dr. Sundari K. and Dr. Satyabhama visited herbal gardens in Trichy between 28 and 30 January 2018 and procured seeds at the Farmers' Seed Depot; the seeds were used for the second sowing on 31 January 2018. Several harvests of broad and string beans, various varieties of gourd and pumpkin have been obtained till April 2018.



The SMCDRIVE began the academic year by organising a summer workshop on Art and Mental Health. This was conducted by Miracle Fingers from 26 to 29 April 2017 for 30 children. Twenty children were sponsored by SMCDRIVE. The workshop included activities such as clay making, palm and foot printing, collage making, playing with sand, colouring, card making and puppetry. Certificates were given to all the participants and the CSR department of LabourNet provided all the children with shoes.

SMCDRIVE organises a clinic for mental health once a month. A team from The Banyan, an NGO, comes to SMCDRIVE every third Saturday of the month. To provide service free of cost. The clinic helps about 20 to 25 patients every month. Counselling services are provided to the students and to the people of neighbouring communities. The Teynampet Police Station also refers cases for counselling.

A Lay Counselling Certificate Course is conducted by The Banyan at SMCDRIVE. There are currently 31 candidates pursuing the six-month course. Another six-month certificate course is offered for various grass-root development and health workers at SMCDRIVE in collaboration with The Banyan and the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute for Youth Development (RGNIYD), a Central University. Currently 28 participants are pursuing this course. Field work training is also provided to the students of the Social Work Department and RGNIYD.

The Nalam Centre at SMCDRIVE seeks to establish wellness-oriented, multi-dimensional services for rehabilitated patients. Some of the activities that are conducted at SMCDRIVE are the making of wire bags, paper bags, jewellery and note pads. Craft activities, weaving, gardening and basic computer skills are also taught. Student Interns pursuing a Postgraduate Degree in Art Therapy from Washington University visited SMCDRIVE and spent three days with the Nalam Centre providing Art Therapy sessions. The College regularly organises exhibitions and sale of products made at the Nalam Centre.

Once a month a representative from the Women's Collective offers training to the women from the

community on indigenous food preparation. Women are taught to make nutritious porridge, groundnut burfi etc. through a practical demonstration. About 150 women benefit from this programme every month.

Around 126 school children from the neighbouring communities are provided educational support through this programme. Regular awareness programmes are also organised for the children and their mothers.

SMCDRIVE also conducts workshops for the students of the College. A five-day workshop on Block Printing was conducted for the students of the B.V.A. Department. A course on Fashion Designing is offered to the students by an expert trainer. There are 92 students this year.

A Workshop on Art Therapy was organised for students on 24 January 2018, by Prof. Ephrat Huss, Professor at Ben-Gurion University, Israel. The Student Leadership Programme is an initiative of the Indian Development Foundation, an NGO that trains school children in leadership skills. An orientation was given to the students of the Department of Social Work. At present three batches of Social Work students are conducting this Programme in three schools in Chennai-Puliyur Government School, Kodambakkam; West Mogappair Government School and Durga Matriculation School, Kodambakkam. A half-day workshop "STEP UP" on Personality Development was organised by SMCDRIVE on 7 October 2017, with Ms. Uma Baskaran and Ms. Subhashree Guruprasad as resource persons

A one day Capacity-Building programme was organised on 28 November 2017. Representatives from various NGOs—Women's Voluntary Service of Tamil Nadu, AlDWA, The Banyan, Arunodaya, Karunalaya, Mottukal, Aarvam, Salesian Institute of Graphic Arts (SIGA), AASHRAYA, Roshini Charitable Trust, and Women & Indian Association—participated in the programme. The sessions focussed on building better family relationships by picturing families through genograms, ecomaps, sociograms and timelines, as well as strengthening relationships through art and role plays.

Representatives from the Women's Development Corporation oriented around 150 women on 12 September 2017 on the formation of selfhelp groups. On 9 February 2018, about 150 women were taught emotional empowerment techniques for Pain and Stress Management SMCDRIVE celebrated Children's Day in a special way on 10 November 2017 for children living with HIV. The programme was organised by the Positive Women's Network and Tamil Nadu AIDS Control Society in collaboration with SMCDRIVE. The Social Work trainees presented a skit on Child Rights and played a video for better understanding of the concept. There was a puppet show which emphasised the need for a proper diet, regular exercise and taking medicine regularly.

SMCDRIVE celebrated Christmas twice—on 19
December 2017, with the women from S S Puram,
Nochinagar, Nochikuppam and Doomikuppam
and on 22 December 2017 with the elderly from

The Career Guidance Cell

The Career Guidance Cell (CGC), an initiative of the AASMC, aims at providing a platform to connect students with companies on campus. Keeping in mind the increase in demand for trained skill sets in freshers the CGC decided to focus on finding new avenues to train the students. The year started with briefing sessions to the entire batch of final year students by the members of the CGC. Students were briefed about the recruitments in the previous year, the companies that came to campus, the kind of jobs offered, the selection process and the skills expected from the students.

In this academic year, 568 students registered for placements. A four-day pre-recruitment workshop was conducted by the CGC on resume writing, cracking aptitude tests, interview techniques and

group discussions. Approximately 280 students attended this programme.

This year, the focus was on training the Pathway students, to improve their employability prospects. In the academic year 2016-17, Mahindra Pride School, a CSR initiative of the Mahindra group of companies, had conducted 80 hours of training for the second year students from economically weaker sections of society. The programme covered topics on personality development and also prepared these students for the campus drive. In continuation of the programme conducted in the previous academic year, a few Pathway students attended a job fair on 10 February 2018, organised for the Mahindra Pride School trainees. In addition to this, a few students from the final year attended a 100 hours

Employability Training Programme. Twenty-four students cleared the interview successfully and were placed in reputed companies. A majority of them were placed in TCS.

The campus recruitment for this year started in August with companies like Deloitte, Ernst & Young, KPMG, Goldman Sachs, Google, RBS, Barclays, Zifo, CITI Bank and Mckinsey selecting the best students. CTS, WIPRO, Verizon, Ramco, L&T, Systech Solutions and Sap Labs also conducted recruitment drives. A number of students from the College were also selected as teachers in schools like Vellammal, Akshar Arbol and Eye Level teaching centres. Other job opportunities included those for analysts, research associates, programmers, content writers, designers, teachers, customer support and HR.

The second year undergraduate students were selected for Internship Programmes by Google, Ernst & Young and Goldman Sachs.

A total number of 60 companies visited the campus this year and 308 jobs were offered to the students. Many more job offers came after the College had closed for exams. These requirements were communicated to the students and interviews were arranged for the interested candidates by these companies at their offices.

Ms.Manisha Jovitha, III B.Sc. Mathematics, was awarded a scholarship to attend the Leadership Conference in Florida and Ms. Agnella, III B.Sc. Mathematics, was awarded a trip to attend the Senior Manager Conference in the Middle East.

The Centre for Women's Studies, in collaboration with the Department of Sociology, organised the celebrations for the International Women's Day on 8 March 2018. The chief guest for the event was Dr. Swarna Rajagopalan, Founder and Managing trustee, The Prajnya Trust, Chennai. In order to commemorate Women's Day, oratorical (Tamil and English), slogan writing, poetry writing, essay writing, photography and poster making competitions were conducted by the Centre and winners were awarded prizes by the chief guest. on Promotion of Folklore, Culture & Heritage of Tamil Nadu for Sustainable Development Phase II

Travel is recognised as one of the best ways to discern what one's country is all about. The second phase of the Project on "Promotion of Folklore, Culture and Heritage of Tamil Nadu for Sustainable Development" aimed at imparting learning through visiting and exploring the lesser known culturally and historically significant places in Tamil Nadu.

Educational trips were organised for students, faculty, retired staff, administrative and support staff. Faculty and students visited historically significant places in Chennai which included the Amir Mahal, Guindy Engineering College, Fort St. George, the Railway Museum and the Kapaleeswarar Temple. Students also had opportunities to interact with vendors at the stalls selling dolls in Mylapore, with artists at the Veethi Virundhu and with weavers at Kanchipuram.

A stall showcasing the lesser known travel destinations of Tamil Nadu was put up by the students of the Heritage Club at the Chennai Trade Fair. Relevant workshops and sessions were organised to make club experiences more meaningful and instructive in line with the objectives of the project.

The Support Staff of the College visited Pulicat, the second largest brackish water lake in India and learnt about its historical and ecological significance. An educational trip to Ooty, Conoor and Mudhumalai was organised for the Administrative Staff of the College. They visited the Doddabetta, the Ooty Botanical Gardens and a tea factory. The highlight of the trip was a visit to the Nazareth Convent at Ootacamund, the first house of the religious Congregation of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary (FMM)

in India. The building designed by the Blessed Mary of Passion, Foundress of the FMM Institute, has on display her possessions and original writings. It was indeed a spiritually satisfying visit. At Conoor, the group visited the tea gardens and a local eucalyptus processing plant and were able to appreciate the biodiversity at the Mudhumalai Wildlife Sanctuary during a safari.

Faculty of the College, Sisters from the Convent and retired faculty toured Thanjavur, Vailankanni, Tharangambadi and Pichavaram. The places visited by them included the Brahadeeswara Temple, shrines at Vailankanni, the Tharangambadi Fort, and the Ziegenbalg Printing Press at Tharangambadi, the first press to print text in Tamil. The trip was rounded off with a boat ride to the mangrove forest at Pichavaram. One of the highlights of this year's activities

was the World Tourism Day Celebrations. The "Absolute Indian Travel Bazaar" was organised in collaboration with the Tamil Nadu Travel Mart Society, the Travel Agents Association of India and the Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation. The event provided scope for showcasing tourist attractions in Tamil Nadu as well and received accolades from the Indian Prime Minister's Office under the "Paryatan Parv". A two-day Travel Mart organised as part of the programme had 30 stalls showcasing travel itineraries. Many of the stalls were manned by students of the Department of History. Several competitions such as Quiz, Travel Writing, Brochure Making, Creative Writing, Monoacting, Destination Marketing and Poster Making were held and these witnessed enthusiastic participation by students of the entire College. A panel discussion on various dimensions of tourism

was led by experienced professionals in the field. Highlighting antiquity, history and the importance of every building on campus, a Heritage Walk was also led by students of the Department of History who were trained in conducting the same by Mr. Vincent D'souza, editor of the The Mylapore Times. A seminar on "Eco-feminist Interpretations of Folktales" was organised by the Departments of English and History. A panel-discussion during the seminar focused on feminist concerns linked to environmental conservation. This included interesting insights into traditional practices in Tamil Nadu.

"Folklore, Culture and Heritage of Tamil Nadu—A Glimpse", a book compiled by the Project Leaders as part of the activities of Phase–I of the Project, was released during the Independence Day celebrations of the College. This book is a collation of facts on Tamil Nadu and was used as a resource to train students of the Heritage Club who, in turn, trained students in schools across Chennai.

We continue to be driven by the vision to create in the College community interest, appreciation, ownership and a desire to conserve tradition and practices. We hope this institutional project will reemphasise the commitment of the College to the preservation and revival of fading art forms and practices and to the enhancement of livelihood opportunities for artistes and local communities.

Train the Trainer Programme with Ms. Cynthia Dettman

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) endeavours to bring in a culture of quality and excellence on campus with a focus on quality enhancement in both academic and administrative tasks. The Executive Committee of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), on the recommendations of the duly appointed peer team, declared an extension of accreditation up to the year 2021 and issued a revised Certificate of Accreditation.

Capacity-building workshops and training sessions on quality enhancement were organised through the year in collaboration with experts from academia, industry and research institutes. A three-day induction programme for the newly recruited faculty members was conducted from 5 to 7 June 2017. They were oriented on the mission and vision of the institution by the

members of the Management and senior faculty. This was followed by training session on essential skills such as communication and counselling.

To enhance academic quality and efficiency in higher education, sessions on curriculum restructuring, current trends in higher education and academic audit were organised on 13 June 2017. The resource persons were Professor Suresh Paul Antony and Dr. Prabhir Vishnu from the Indian Institute of Management (IIM), Tiruchrapalli. A lecture emphasising the effectiveness of "Research-based Education and Training" was delivered by Dr. S. Vincent, Dean of Research and UGC Projects, Loyola College (Autonomous) on 14 June 2017.

To train mid- and senior-level faculty on the internal audit process, a three-day training and

internal audit course on ISO 9001:2015 was organised on 7, 8 and 11 Sept 2017. The course was conducted in collaboration with a Norway based organisation, DNV GL Det Norske Veritas. This training programme initiated the year-long self-study by the departments.

Eight training sessions on "Student-centered Learning" were conducted between December 2017 and March 2018 by Ms Cynthia Dettman, Fulbright-Nehru Scholar from Highlands University, Albuquerque, New Mexico, USA. These sessions focussed on the creative and effective use of technology to meet

student learning goals. A one-day session on Interpersonal Skills and Team Work was organised for the Administrative Staff on 20 March 2018.

In collaboration with the USIEF, and with Ms. Cynthia Dettman as the resource person, two sessions of "Train the Trainers Programme" were organised on 6 & 7 March 2018 and 13 & 14 March 2018. The programme was extended to faculty members of other colleges such as Women's Christian College, Patrician College, Madras School of Social Work, and Senthamarai College of Arts and Science, Madurai.










The Stella Maris College Hostels

Departmental Activities



Department of History

The Department has distinguished itself as a centre of excellence by equipping students with life skills, independent thinking skills and by transforming them into empowered, independent women. It prepares the students for a career in tourism and for various competitive exams like the UPSC.

At the Tamil Nadu Tourism Awards 2017, the Department was recognised as the "Best in Tourism Education". The Department helped organise the Madras Week, "Madras 600086" on campus from 22 to 31 August 2017. There were talks on the history of Madras, traditional water conservation techniques, solid waste management and prominent women of Madras. Traditional food and game stalls, a philately exhibition by the Postal Department and videos from the archives of the British Council provided glimpses of the old Madras. Heritage walks on the grounds of Guindy Engineering College, Fort St. George and Stella Maris College took students back in time to the city of yesteryears. Several field trips were organised by the

Department to places of historical importance in Chennai such as Amir Mahal in Royapettah, the Integral Coach Factory in Perambur, Fort St. George, etc. The Sharma Institute of Heritage Education, Sholinganallur run by Dr. Shanti Pappu, an alumna and a distinguished archaeologist, conducted workshops on primitive life and making of metal sculptures. The third year students went on an educational tour to Mysore, Bengaluru and Coorg in November 2017.

To celebrate World Tourism Day, the Department organised "Absolute Indian Travel Bazaar". Competitions, panel discussions and exhibitions were held as a part of the event on 6 and 7 October 2017. The Travel Mart received the support of the Travel Agents Association of India, Tamil Nadu Travel Mart Society, Indian Tourism, and Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation. The event was recognised by the Prime Minister's Office as part of the "Paryatan Parv" or travel festival, an initiative of the Ministry of Tourism. This event was coordinated by the Department in collaboration with Mr. Sriharan

Balan, Director, Madura Travel Service Pvt. Ltd. The event was the outcome of the United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia (UBCHEA) project on the "Promotion of Folklore, Culture and Heritage of Tamil Nadu for Sustainable Development". The project which is currently in its second phase focusses on promoting travel to lesser known destinations of Tamil Nadu. The annual Indira Gandhi Endowment Lecture was delivered by an alumna, Ms. Sheela Murthy, Founder and President of the Murthy Law Firm, Maryland, USA on 5 January 2018. The students were deeply inspired by her achievements and her motivational talk. A panel discussion on "Ecofeminist Interpretations of Folktales" held on 7 February 2018 was jointly organised with the Department of English.



A Certificate Course in Spanish for Tourism, was conducted from July to October 2017 in collaboration with the Medrar Cultural Service Connecting Continents, Chennai. A Certificate Course on Mandarin was held from November 2017 to February 2018 in collaboration with Sprach Lingua, Chennai. The Department also introduced two skill-based certificate courses-Event Management and Airport Management. The students of the Department, along with students of the departments of Public Relations,

Botany and B.Voc., put up a stall at the 43rd Trade Fair organised by the TTDC at Island Grounds from 7 to 13 February 2017. It served as a platform for the students to showcase their talent in making models, organising games, explaining charts and making presentations to the general public on the theme, "Lesser Known Tourist Destinations in Tamil Nadu". The students of the Department had an interactive session with the Honourable Lieutenant Governor of Pondicherry, Dr. Kiran Bedi, IPS, (Retd.) on 19 March 2018 at Raj Nivas. She reminded students that their access to higher education had opened the window to limitless opportunities. On 20 March 2018, the Department organised campus recruitment for third year students, in which several travel agencies, hospitality firms and airline companies participated.

As the Department of History and Tourism concludes its Diamond Jubilee celebrations, it acknowledges the contributions of all those who have been part of this historic journey.



Best in Tourism Education Award



Sociology, as a discipline helps one to think, reason, rationalise, challenge the status quo, and empower individuals to become aware of their rights and responsibilities as citizens. With this vision, the Department of Sociology began the academic session 2017–18 in the spirit of empowerment. The Department's activities this year revolved around the theme of "Law and Social Change".

Kaarmal Nisha, Founder, Uyir Kural, an International NGO and an alumna of the Department, delivered a lecture on abortion, a topic that needs to be drawn into public discourse, especially in India. A short movie was screened at the end of an interactive session where the students engaged with the social and legal complexities associated with abortion in India.

With an alarming increase in the number of juvenile crimes and the recent spate of heinous acts involving juveniles, juvenile justice has become an important area for sociological exploration. The Department invited Professor M. Srinivasan, Head, Department of Criminology, Madras University, for an enlightening lecture and an interactive session on the juvenile justice system in India.

Deforestation, ozone depletion, global warming, and the unsustainable use of natural resources are some of the environmental issues that are plaguing the world at present with ramifications for human health, law and economics. The "Re-Green Chennai" initiative, envisioned by Fr. Jegath Gaspar Raj, Founder, Tamil Maiyam, aims

at restoring the green cover which the city had lost during Cyclone Vardah in 2016.

Fr. Gasper Raj delivered an inspiring speech on the topic, following which the Earth Smiles Trust's project, "Re-Green Chennai" was flagged off on campus. The Principal, Dr. Sr. Jasintha Quadras, fmm, Secretary, Sr. Susan Matheikal, fmm, the speakers, faculty and students planted saplings on the College grounds. Tamizh Thalaiva, the Chennai-based Kabaddi team owned by the cricketing legend Sachin Tendulkar, lent a hand in planting the saplings, and also played a friendly match adding to the excitement of the day.

The Department organised two-day workshop in November 2018, on "Sustainable Development," conducted by AIESEC, a global organisation for youth leadership. The workshop focussed on the need for youth leadership to achieve a sustainable future. One of the most memorable moments of the year was the International Conference on "Team Leadership: Collaboration, Management and Empowerment" held on 16 November 2018 in collaboration with the Trinity Western University. The Department of Social Work, the Department of Commerce, Shift II and the International Research Cell of the College collaborated in organising the conference. The Department hosted a session on "Student Engagement and Leadership," with presentations from both alumnae and international students.

The discipline of Sociology, although brimming with potential, remains on the periphery of mainstream academics in most parts of the country. The Department, therefore, as its

mission, motivates school students in Chennai to pursue this dynamic subject through Interschool competitions "Socio-Genesis" for school students. This was the third edition of the competition.

The Department ensures that opportunities are provided to encourage students to face challenges in life. The annual intradepartmental competition, "August Revel" was conducted on 6 February 2018. At the annual Sr. Christine Antony Endowment Lecture, Dr. Marc Groenhuijsen, President, World Society of Victimology and Professor, Department of Criminal Law, Tilburg Law School, delivered the keynote address on "New Horizons in Victimology". He addressed some of the emerging trends in Victimology, touching upon issues of privacy in modern technology.

The Department offered three Certificate Courses—Sociology of Health Education (in collaboration with Apollo Hospitals), Personality Development for Career Excellence and Media and Society.

Valedictory Function at the International Conference on Developmental Challenges in India

Department of Economics

To mark the completion of 70 eventful years, the Department of Economics hosted an International Conference on "Developmental Challenges in India" on 30 and 31 January 2018. The conference featured discussions on emerging challenges and opportunities by eminent speakers such as Dr. Shanthanayanan Deverajan, Senior Economist, World Bank; Dr. Deepak Mohanty, Executive Director, Reserve Bank of India; Dr. Kalpana Kochhar, Director, Human Resources Department, IMF and faculty from National University of Singapore, Yale University, Princeton University and University of Delhi. This two-day conference provided a platform for leaders, academicians, researchers and policy-makers to share their ideas and views on contributing to a growth that represents the true wealth of a nation.

A six-day workshop on "Advanced Time Series Econometrics" was conducted for faculty, research scholars and postgraduate students from 3 to 8 July 2017 in collaboration with The Indian Econometric Society (TIES), New Delhi, to emphasise the importance of time series econometric analysis (EVIEWS Software) using high frequency economic and financial data. The resource persons were Dr. M. Ramachandran, Vice-President TIES; Dr. Sunil Paul, Professor, Madras School of Economics; Mr. Edwin Prabu, AGM, Reserve Bank of India; Mr. Hersch Sahay, JRF Pondicherry University.

On 8 August 2017, Dr. Arvind Subramanian, Chief Economic Advisor to the Government of India delivered the Dr. Sr. Helen Vincent Endowment Lecture on "What have I learnt about Economic Development from Literature". He urged the

students to read more books beyond Economics as this would make the subject come alive. A series of lectures were also organised as part of the anniversary celebrations of the Department. Dr. Karthik Muralidharan, Associate Professor of Economics, University of California, San Diego delivered a lecture on "Improving Education Quality in India: Challenges and Opportunities" on 11 December 2017. Dr. R. Srinivasan, Registrar, University of Madras, addressed the students of the Department on "GST: Design Deficiency and the Way Forward" on 12 September 2017. The other lectures included "Economic History of India since 1951" by Dr. R. Srinivasan and "Current Issues in Open Economy Macro Economics" by Dr. C. Selvaraj, former Head, Department of Economics, Madras Christian College.

Summer Internships for the postgraduate students at the World Trade Organization, New Delhi, Department of Economics and Statistics, DMS and M. S. Swaminathan Research Foundation opened new avenues in terms of experiential learning and job placements and

also offered ample scope for research activity. The Department offered a range of certificate courses on Insurance and Risk Management, Financial Planning and Portfolio Management, Capital Markets and Gender & Work. Transporting industry knowledge to the classroom, the resource persons provided students with a meaningful and practical learning experience. This year a new course on Digital Marketing and Business Data Analytics was introduced on popular demand. On an average, 130 students from the Department enroll for these courses. Ten students will receive a Diploma in Financial Services this year.

The Department records with pride that Subi Suvetha of second B.A. Economics was the only Indian to reach the quarter-finals in the 100 mts. event at World Roller Games, Nanjing, China. She also won a gold medal in the 100 mts. in the 55th National Speed Skating Championships, Chennai, in the Senior Women category, which makes her the fastest skater in India.

Department of English

Department of Fine Arts

The Department of Fine Arts conducted year-round activities and collaborative projects. The year began with the annual Dr. Sr. Edith Tomöry Endowment Lecture titled "Athena's Tree: Some Thoughts on Contemporary Printmaking" delivered by Ms. Parvathy Nayar, contemporary artist, on 3 August 2017.

The highlight of the academic year was the International Conference "Circles of Creativity: Paradigms in Art and Design" held on 8 and 9 February 2018. The conference sessions explored photography, media, design, art and craft as independent disciplines that at the same time connect and inform each other in contemporary practice and contexts. Workshops on drawing, painting, scratchboard art and typography were conducted by four of the invited speakers—Dr. Donal Maloney from Liverpool Hope University, UK; Professors Mark Hogenson and Alba De Leon from Palo Alto College, San Antonio, Texas;

and Dr. Udayakumar Dharmalingam from the Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati.

The Department collaborated with the University of Sunderland, UK, on a Summer Study Abroad programme "Art and Design Inspiration" from 16 to 30 July 2017, for a group of 19 students, accompanied by Dr. Lakshmi Priya Daniel. The programme offered art and design sessions with field visits to Durham and Edinburgh. Gallery and museum visits in Newcastle and London completed an intense and enriching experience for the group.

Student papers on varied on-campus and off-campus learning opportunities that have been an integral part of their educational experience were presented at a Student Seminar titled "Speak 2018" on 27 February 2018. With art history being a focal area in the BVA curriculum, two guest lectures were delivered by visiting American

Several workshops brought artists, designers and crafts persons to share their expertise with enthusiastic students, including sessions on sculpture, metal embossing and photography.

A collaborative endeavour by the Department, the Consulate General of the Federal Republic of Germany, Chennai, and Tape That Collective,



Goethe-Institut, Chennai, resulted in a unique workshop on tape art held on 30 and 31 August 2017. Artists Thomas Meissner, Stefan Busch and Felix Rodewaldt from Germany guided 30 students to create artworks that were then exhibited at Spaces in Besant Nagar. Another collaborative project with the Goethe-Institut resulted in "Meeting Reinhard Kleist", German graphic designer and comic artist, who conducted

an illustration workshop for 35 students on 12 December 2017. This was followed by "Illustrating the Sands"—a collaborative art event held at Elliot's Beach in Besant Nagar. A performance by students from Nalanda Way Foundation was illustrated by Fine Arts students along with Mr. Kleist. The Prakriti Foundation, in collaboration with the Departments of Fine Arts and English, brought together poetry and

Department of Mathematics

The academic year 2017–18 began with an enrichment programme for the faculty and research scholars of the Department—a workshop on "MATLAB" by Mr. Venkatesan, Asst. Professor, Kongu Engineering College, Coimbatore and Ms. Dhanalakshmi V., Asst. Professor, Stella Maris College, from 3 to 5 July 2017. The workshop motivated the participants to utilise the software for teaching, demonstration, and for research presentations and publications.

The intercollegiate Math Fest, "MATH ZOOM 2017", was held on 22 July 2017. Around 30 colleges participated in the event and the overall rolling trophy was won by Madras Christian College. The tenth interyear competition of the Department, "Math O Match", was conducted on 5 January 2018. This year saw the introduction of an innovative event, Creative Thinking, which was a great success. The first year postgraduate students of the Department emerged as overall winners. The coordinators of the Integra Forum,

Ms. Josephine Lissie, Dr. Sarah Surya and Dr. Devipriya, ensured the smooth conduct of the two programmes.

On 27 July 2017, the twelfth Dr. J. Thangamani Endowment Lecture was organised by the Department for the final year undergraduate and postgraduate students. A lecture titled "The Line of Best Fit" was delivered by Dr. Raghavan K. N., Professor, Institute of Mathematical Sciences, Chennai. The International Symposium conducted by the Department on "Recent Trends in Research Practices" held on 28 July 2017, emphasised the significant functioning of the research institution and the various duties of the research committees. Prof. Atulya K. Nagar, Dean of Science, Liverpool Hope University, UK, conducted a session on "Applications of Mathematics" and Prof. K. G. Subramanian, UGC (India) Emeritus Fellow, Dept. of Mathematics, MCC moderated the panel discussion on various challenges faced by research guides and scholars.

The Department organised a number of exhibitions and guest lectures as part of the students' learning experience. **Exhibitions** "Elements of Differential Equations", "Fascinating World of Mathematics", "Analytical Geometry" and "Applications of Mathematics in Real Life" were organised to promote selflearning among students. Resource persons from various institutions and organisations from India and abroad were invited to address the students through seminars and workshops to enhance their technical skills.

The Department conducted a one-day seminar on 10 August 2017 on "Astronomy". It also conducted guest lectures on "Planarity and Crossing Number of Graphs", "AVD Colouring of Certain Interconnection Networks" and "Applications of Differential Equations". Apart from these, a week-long series of workshops on "Techniques and Applications in Mathematical Sciences" was organised to give postgraduates and research scholars of the Department an in-depth understanding of Mathematics at the research level. Renowned mathematician, Dr. Prasun Kumar Nayak, Associate Professor,

Midnapore College, West Bengal, was the resource person. The students of the Department of Mathematics visited Devadas Telescoptics on 31 January 2018 to observe a rare lunar phenomenon—a super moon, a blue moon and a blood moon which occurred after a period of 152 years.

During the academic year, the Department witnessed significant growth in its research and development activities. The faculty and research scholars of the Department have published fourteen papers in peer reviewed journals. The Department now boasts of ten M.Phil. and five Ph.D. guides.

A part-time research scholar of the Department, Ms. Vasanthika, Assistant Professor, Mathematics Division, School of Advanced Sciences, VIT, Chennai, passed away on 21 January 2018 at the age of 41. Her Ph.D. programme was on the verge of being completed under the able guidance of Dr. Sr. Jasintha Quadras, fmm. She was a soft spoken, charming person with great intelligence who will be greatly missed.

The Department organised the Annual Popular Lecture Series with lectures delivered by eminent scientists and academicians. 



Dr. Chitralekha Ramachandran and Dr. Annie Cherian, retired members of the Department were also resource persons during a workshop on "Methodology for Studying Animal Behavior" conducted for third year students on 20 November 2017. The workshop laid the foundation for projects carried out by the students on this subject.

A workshop on "Stored Product Insect Pests" was organised on 28 August 2017 for the first year

students. The General Manager (QC) of the Food Corporation of India, Dr. G. Nagabhushanam, enlightened the students on the problems caused by insect pests infesting stored products and the importance of quarantine. Hands-on training was given to students on the identification and natural control of common pests infesting stored food. A "Butterfly Week" was organised in the third week of July 2017. It began with more than a hundred students from different disciplines participating in Butterfly Walks on campus over the course of three days. A total of 31 species of butterflies was observed during this time. A drawing and painting competition was conducted on the themes "Designs Inspired by Butterflies" and "Butterflies in their Natural Habitat". A presentation on "Butterflies on Campus" was also

screened at the OAT. Dr. Kalpana Jayaraman cowrote a chapter on "Ecosystem" in the Manual for Teachers of Environmental Science brought out by the Centre for Environmental Studies, Lady Doak College, Madurai.

The first year students had a memorable visit to the field laboratory of the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute at Kovalam on 10 August 2017 during which they were enlightened on the subject of sustainable aquaculture. Moults of lobsters were given to the visitors to take home as souvenirs. The third year students visited the Tamil Nadu University for Veterinary and Animal Sciences on 19 September 2017. A study trip to Pondicherry was also arranged for them on 3 March 2018.

The annual Dr. Meera Paul and Dr. Hannah John Endowment Lecture titled "Signalling Kinases in Cancer Biology" was delivered by Dr. Rayala Suresh Kumar, Associate Professor, Department of Biotechnology, IIT Madras, on 7 September 2017. The students of the Department benefited from interactions with experts, through the year, on varied topics such as Proteomics and Genomics, Genetic Counseling, Prospects in Marine Biology, Wildlife Conservation, Disappearance of Sparrows from Chennai. Research scholars from IISc, Bengaluru interacted with the third year students on research methodology in ecological studies.

Students of Hobart Matriculation School and Chennai Girls Higher Secondary School visited the Department on 7 December 2017. They were given inputs on DNA isolation, microbial staining, and stored product pests. They also viewed a display of specimens of the animal kingdom. "Exzoobition", the annual exhibition on everything zoological was held on 6 January 2018. The students enthralled visitors from other Departments of the College with their exhibits which ranged from snakes spewing venom to micro-organisms in space.

In keeping with the mission of the College to promote holistic growth, the third year students were exposed to social issues through the Service Learning Programme. Several guest lectures and workshops gave the students a richer experience on aspects of good health and effective communication. The students conducted awareness programmes on the spread, prevention and treatment of Dengue and Leprosy at St. Raphael's Girls Higher Secondary

School, Mylapore, St. Anthony's Girls Higher Secondary School and Rosary Matriculation Higher Secondary School.

Dr. P. Shanmugam, Senior Principal Scientist and Commonwealth Fellow, Department of Environmental Technology, Central Leather Research Institute, Adyar, inaugurated the annual intercollegiate cultural competition "Synapse 2017–18" on 3 February 2018. Department of Psychology



The Department of Psychology welcomed its second batch of students in the academic year 2017–2018. Inauguration of Silver Jubilee Celebrations





The academic year 2017–18 was one of special importance for the Department of Commerce—Shift II as it celebrates the 25th year of its existence. The Silver Jubilee celebrations were inaugurated on 21 July 2018 with an inaugural address by Ms. Ray Simon, former Vice-President, Students' Union, and currently Senior Director HR, Capgemini, and a special address by Ms. Vinutha Subramaniam, CEO and Director, Parisera. Both speakers laid emphasis on the changing dimensions of accounting professionals in today's industrial framework.

A Postgraduate Diploma in Global Business and Finance—an exclusive Programme integrating the

Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA) Curriculum, in association with the International Skill Development Company (ISDC) —was started in October 2017. The fifteen-month course offers a dual certification to students and also allows exemptions from appearing for some papers for CIMA. "SAP ERP-Financial Accounting and Control" was integrated into the academic curriculum for students of B. Com. Accounting & Finance with ANSA India Pvt. Ltd. as the knowledge partners.

An Entrepreneurial Development Cell (EDC) was started with 200 members, in association with the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development,



Anna University. It was inaugurated by Dr. G. Ravikumar, Director, EDII. Ms. Neelam Palrecha, CEO, Periferry, and an alumna of the Department, delivered a special address on Social Entrepreneurship on this occasion. As a followup action, a series of lectures and workshops were organised to encourage students in entrepreneurial ventures. The programmes focussed on enhancing the entrepreneurial skills of the students and improving their outlook towards starting their own business. The panelists were young entrepreneurs from various fields of business such as Ms. Mahalakshmi Saravanan. founder, Women Entrepreneurs India; Mr. Shiv Shankar Ganesh, founder and CEO, Kaching; Ms. Nandita Pandey, founder and Director, Strata Vision Pvt. Ltd.; Ms. Aishwarya, co-founder, Prem's Graama Bhojanam; Mr. Cibi Selvan, founder, Regeno and Mr. Vasant Sridhar, co-founder, OfBusiness. The subsequent sessions by Mr. A.D. Padmasingh Isaac, Chairman and Managing Director, AACHI Group of Companies, Mr. Hanif Sattar, founder, Basics, and Ms. Patricia Narayan, Director, Sandeepha Chain of Hotels, featured success stories in their own domain. Dr. Deepak Swaminathan, founder, Director, Media Point and PEPUP Cloud Technologies, and a serial entrepreneur, also spoke on entrepreneurial skills. The concluding session of the day was by Mr. Rangarajan M. Executive Director, Servion Global Solutions who shared customer-centric business ideas. A video presentation featuring the success stories of Ms. Sundari, street food entrepreneur, Mr. R.U. Department of Computer Science



The academic year 2017–18 was filled with a flurry

of academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities in which students participated with enthusiasm and zeal.

The Department of Computer Science has responded to the unique challenge of keeping pace with the rapid and phenomenal changes in technology, the advent of new applications, fields and environment while at the same time having a firm grounding in the basic concepts, through its well-designed curriculum framed in consultation with experts from academia and the industry. In an important step in this direction, the Department organised its first International Conference on Advancements in Computing Technologies (ICACT 2018) on 2 and 3 February 2018. Sixty-five research papers were presented at the conference which served as a forum for researchers, academicians and students to share knowledge, expertise and experiences. Eminent academicians from reputed institutions such as Le Tourneau University, USA; University of Leeds, UK; Birmingham State University, UK; Indian

Institute of Technology, Madras; Christ University, Bangalore and experts from industry such as Cognizant Technology Solutions, Wipro, Tech Mahindra, Ada's List, UK shared their insights and expertise. A video-conference session on "Agile Software Development Model" was conducted by Ms. Pradeepa Narayanasamy, Cox Automative Inc., US. This enabled students to understand the current software model followed widely in the industry.

The Department planned meticulously to keep faculty members and students updated on recent developments in the field. Internet of Things (IoT) is creating an atmosphere of convergence in the society. This technology is bringing a paradigm shift in our professional and personal lives. Keeping this in mind, faculty were given training in IoT followed by a one-day workshop for 32 students on using Raspberry Pi on 27 January 2018. Three teams of students are doing their final semester projects in this field— Automatic Speed Controller, Obstacle Detector and Water Level Monitoring.

As technology makes rapid strides and the field becomes extremely competitive, there is a critical need to secure data and systems. To create an understanding of hacking techniques, a two-day workshop for students on "Ethical Hacking" was organised on 8 and 9 September 2017 in collaboration with IIT E-Cell and 69 students participated in this event.

To enable students to face the placement process with confidence, the Department organised an 18-hour aptitude training programme in collaboration with Vistamind. To motivate the students to become entrepreneurs, a session on "How about being an Entrepreneur?" was organised with Mr. Prabhu, CEO, Base2 Technologies delivering a motivational speech on the why, how and what of entrepreneurship. A session on "Research and its Importance" was organised to enhance research capacity in students. Fifty research papers were presented at various conferences by the students of the Department. Forty three research papers were published by final year postgraduate students in UGC approved journals and three papers were selected for publication in Scopus-indexed journals. Dr. I. Lakshmi published 20 research papers in various journals.

Students of the Department participated in different workshops and intercollegiate technical fests organised by various colleges. They emerged overall winners in the intercollegiate technical fest "OLAP" organised by MOP Vaishnav College for Women.

In order to ensure that students experience a holistic learning environment, the Department

creates opportunities for them to apply the knowledge gained in classrooms in a practical context for a better understanding of work processes and business functions. Industrial visits are one such practice of the Department which gives greater clarity and understanding of the theoretical concepts gained, as students practically experience how these concepts can be put into action. The postgraduate students of the Department went on an industrial visit to Intellect Design Arena Ltd., Chennai. The visit triggered a lot of questions regarding business from students and it was a great experience for them. As part of the Social Awareness Programme, the first year postgraduate students visited schools and created awareness on health and hygiene through various interactive activities and the second year undergraduate students shared their knowledge on the basics of computers with less privileged students in schools. The participants became aware of ways in which they could reach out to society at large.

The Department is proud of its confident and successful alumnae. At the "Alumnae Meet" of the Department, the participants were happy not only reliving their past, but also sharing their success stories in their respective fields. The Meet brought to the fore their keen interest and willingness to be involved in the activities of the Department in future. As a befitting recognition of its efforts, the Department was awarded All India Fifth Rank in the survey conducted by the India Today Group for the year 2017. Stepping into the twentieth year of its inception, the Department aims at reaching many more milestones in the upcoming academic year.



The academic year 2017–18 began meaningfully with the Department of Social Work partnering with the Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation, Bachpan Bachao Andolan, Hand in Hand, India and Chennai Coordinating Committee in launching the Chennai arm of "Bharat Yatra", a Nationwide Campaign for Safe Childhood-Safe India, on 13 September 2017. The Yatra was flagged off by the Honorable Chief Justice of Madras High Court, Ms. Indira Banerjee, and Nobel Peace Laureate 2014, Mr. Kailash Satyarthi who led the Bharat Yatra. The entire College community took a pledge and participated in the Yatra on campus raising slogans for the safety of the girl child.

As part of the Bharat Yatra, a National Consultation was held on the same day with Young Survivors of Child Abuse, who shared their life experiences of humiliation and exploitation. The children

shared their stories of overcoming traumatic experiences such as child abuse and drug abuse through rehabilitation by NGOs and spoke about the need for justice in the presence of the Honourable Chief Justice of Madras High Court Ms. Indira Banerjee and Nobel Peace Laureate 2014, Mr. Kailash Satyarthi. The programme was jointly organised by the International Justice Mission, the Department of Social Work and several NGOs in the city.

The Annual Rev. Sr. Thecla Endowment Lecture for the year 2017 was delivered by Ms. Nina P. Nayak, Member, Governing Council, Indian Law Institute, New Delhi, former member of the National Council for Protection of Children and a distinguished alumna on "Understanding Child Rights in Human Rights Perspective and Advancing Child Rights in India" on 27 September 2017. Ms. Nina P. Nayak gave an



inspiring speech on the vulnerable situation of children in India and highlighted the role of social workers in using policies and laws to resolve issues and provide support to children.

The International Human Rights Day 2017 and the International Day of Persons with Disabilities 2017 were commemorated on 30 November 2017 in collaboration with the Australian High Commission, Chennai. Mr. Curtis McGrath, OAM (Medal of the Order of Australia), Para Canoeist and Gold Medallist 2016 Rio Paralympics, was the Chief Guest. Mr. McGrath shared his courageous, inspirational life story of overcoming the tragedy of losing both his legs, while serving in the Australian Army, when he stepped on an improvised explosive device (IED). Within two years of the tragedy, Mr. Curtis overcame his disability through sheer grit and painstaking efforts to win many world records. He went on to become a motivational speaker and sports ambassador. Ms. Abinaya from III B.A. Sociology also shared her empowering experiences as a student of Stella Maris College. Ms. Sophie Smith, Second Secretary and Consul for the Australian Consulate General, Chennai, was the Guest of Honour at the programme. UNICEF's Global Report on Children in a Digital World was released on 11 December 2017 by Mr. Job Zachariah, Chief of UNICEF Office for Tamil Nadu & Kerala, and Ms. M. P. Nirmala, IAS, Chairperson, Tamil Nadu Commission for Protection of Child Rights. The programme was hosted by UNNATHI, the Social Work Students' Forum, in association with Thozhamai.

A short-term Certificate Course on Personal Empowerment in Emergency Response (PEER), recognised by the Government of Tamil Nadu, was organised for the first time in collaboration with Alert—We Care, a Non-governmental Organisation, for 85 BSW and MSW students in July–August 2017. The students attended theory and practical sessions in responding to

The Department had the privilege of a Visiting Faculty—a Fullbright Scholar from USA—Dr. Karen Kayser, Professor, Dr. Renato, La Rocca Chair of Oncology Social Work, University of Louisville, Kent School of Social Work. She taught a course on community approaches to promote Health Equity for II MSW students from January to March 2018. A video-conference session was held between Social Work students of Stella Maris and students from the Kent School of Social Work who were studying the same course in USA. Another Fullbright Scholar residing in Stella Maris College, Ms. Cynthia Dettman, delivered guest lectures on Feminist Practice in Social Work and Social Group Work with Communities, for MSW students on 31 January and 1 February 2018.

Colombo, Sri Lanka, for the Regional Training Programme on Research Methodologies for a collaborative research study on Continuing Education for Disadvantaged Adolescents in South Asia of the International Federation of Catholic Universities, from 26 to 28 June 2018 for the IFCU research. The "Woman of Substance Award" was conferred on Ms. Lora Deva Prasana, Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, by Women's Rights Organisation, Puducherry, on 26 March 2017. The Award was presented by the Honourable Chief Minister of Puducherry, Mr. V. Narayanaswamy. Ms. Swetha Varadhan, II MSW, received the Best Social Worker Award from Social Protection Legal Aid and Humanity Organisation on 10 December 2017 The award was given by Ms. Irom Sharmila, a well-known Human Rights activist.

Release of Global Report on Children in a Digital





The B.Voc. Programmes aim at creating an 'industry fit' skilled workforce. The programmes—Food Processing & Quality Control and Sustainable Energy Management—have a rigorous academic process with a thrust on experiential learning and training in the laboratories and industries, that enhances employability skills in students.

The first year students of the Food Processing and Quality Control (FP&QC) programme underwent various training sessions at Mega Foods, Rohini Foods, HECS, KVIC, French Loaf, Winners Bakery and Hot Breads. A workshop was organised to impart the skills of fine baking and presenting of baked goods. The second year students underwent training at Aavin, KVIC and

Akshaya Aqua Farms. They attended workshops on dairy products and food analysis techniques. To facilitate experiential learning, a state-of-theart Baking Lab was set up for the Department of Food Processing and Quality Control.

The first year students of the Sustainable Energy Management (SEM) programme underwent rigorous training sessions at KVIC, NIN Energy Technologies and had workshops on Batteries, Home Lighting, Home Energy Management and Energy Audit. They also conducted an "Industrial Energy Audit" at Spectrum Mall. Industrial visits were organised to solar installations at various places in Chennai. The second year students had their training at Diamond Enterprises and KVIC. Industrial visits to Kothari Biofuels,

IIT Madras, Biogas plants at Ambattur, Anna Nagar and Padi helped the students gain knowledge on different biogas installations and the role of the community in segregation of waste and its utilisation. Workshops were also organised on "Waste Management and Waste Conversion Techniques", "Waste to Energy" and "Vermicomposting". To utilise the food waste generated in the campus, a biogas plant was commissioned with the added advantage of providing hands-on-training to students in the production of biogas to students on campus. The purpose of this plant is to convert organic waste into useable products—energy and manure.

The National Skill Development Corporation conducted an independent assessment of the skills learnt by the students. Food Industry Capacity and Skill Initiative (FICSI) and the Sector Skills Council for Food Industry, conducted assessments for the Qualification Pack "Jam, Jelly and Ketchup Processing Technician" at Level 4 of the National Skill Qualification Framework and for the Qualification Pack "Plant Baker" at level 5. These assessments were conducted by independent organisations and all the students who appeared were certified as being "Job Ready". Similarly, Green Jobs, the Sector Skills Council for the Sustainable Energy Sector, conducted the assessments for the Qualification Packs, "Solar PV Installer (Suryamitra)" at level 4 and "Rooftop Solar Grid Engineer" at level 5. All the students of the Sustainable Energy Programme cleared the tests.

A one-day seminar titled "Food Quality and Food Safety" was organised by the Food Processing and Quality Control Department.

The Department of Sustainable Energy Management also organised a one-day seminar titled "Eclectica 2K18—A Road to Sustainability" on the theme, green energy production and energy conservation. Demonstration of waste utilisation for energy and energy management were also conducted. The students exhibited models on the central theme which were greatly appreciated. Students enthusiastically participated in seminars organised at Loyola College, Ethiraj College, TANUVAS and KVIC and their skill-sets were duly recognised by the prizes they won at the events.



PR Campaign UNAVU- Voice Against Waste

Department of Public Relations

Department of Public Relations began the academic year with a Scholarin-Residence programme by inviting Ms. Sarah D'Souza (Senior Communications Specialist, Intuit India, Bengaluru) on 11 and 12 August 2017. The session focussed on "Ideas and Innovations in Organisational Communication". On 9 September 2017, the Department organised "Media Surf", an intercollegiate competition for students of Media and Communication. The event was inaugurated by actor Jayaprakash, who sensitised the students on media ethics and practices. In September 2017, the Department organised a workshop on blogging conducted by Ms. Swapnil Midha, a PR professional with a focus on social media and organisational communication.

The PR Department, in collaboration with Earth Smiles, an NGO working for environmental welfare, and the Department of Sociology, steered a campaign "Re-Green Chennai" in the month of October 2017. The campaign was initiated to sensitise school students to the need to improve the green cover of the city. The Department executed the campaign in ten schools across the city and provided over 25 tree saplings to the schools. In February 2018 the Department rolled



out its signature PR Campaign "Unavu-Voice against Waste". The campaign was organised by the final-year students, and was aimed at creating awareness on the social, economic and environmental effects of food wastage. The campaign was inaugurated by the celebrity chef Dr. K. Damodaran who highlighted the alarming amount of food wastage at consumption level and shared simple recipes with leftover food in order to minimise food wastage in households. The Department was also involved in the 44th Industrial Trade Fair organised by the Department of Education, Government of Tamil Nadu, the theme being "Green Life". Students of first year MA conducted various games and presented a puppet show while the second year MA students utilised the platform to create awareness about the campaign "Unavu—Voice against Waste".

The Department organised an Interdepartmental Conference on "Digital Communication and Society" on 27 February

2018. The Keynote Address on "Convergent Journalism: Opportunities and Challenges" was delivered by Mr. Mukund Padmanabhan, Editor-in-Chief of The Hindu. This was followed by a panel discussion with pioneers in the field of Digital Communication—Ms. Rama Subramaniyam (Axiom), Ms. Pavithra Charan (Inception Business Services), Ms. Subakeerthana (The Indian Express) and Ms. Mahalakshmi Saravanan (Women Entrepreneurs India).

Students of the Department were taken on an industrial visit to Larsen & Toubro to help them understand their CSR activities and corporate structure. They were also taken to Anna Community Radio and the Institute of Printing Technology, Taramani to familiarise them with community radio shows and different techniques used in printing. The students were also given an opportunity to create and record PSAs on "Unavu—Voice against Waste".







The Dolls' Story

Navarathri in Chennai (Dussehra in North India) has often been described as the 'Dolls' Festival'. Several households display a collection of dolls (called 'golu') arranged aesthetically, even thematically—the themes relating to activities in daily life, mythological stories, etc. Mada Street in Mylapore has long been the place to buy these dolls.

The UBCHEA supported institutional project on "Promotion of Folklore, Culture and Heritage of Tamil Nadu for Sustainable Development" has made us more aware of our rich culture and heritage and also sparked a sense of curiosity about some of these traditional practices that we take for granted—Who made these dolls? Where did they come from? What's the story behind the colourful clay, papier mache and marble dolls? Is the demand for them the same as it was decades earlier? Armed with a camera, a recorder and a thirst for information, we set out to find answers to these questions. Our destination—North Mada Street, Mylapore.

Let me first describe the surroundings to you. A long street. Thousands of dolls, of every colour you can possibly think of. Hundreds of people milling about. Dozens of shops and vendors. The strong fragrance of jasmine floating in the air. Voices from every side—admiring, bargaining, refusing; so loud that you can't hear yourself think! There were so many shops along the pavement that it seemed a Herculean task to navigate without knocking anyone (or anything) over. With the stage thus set, we started our interviews with the vendor closest to us.

"It's a family business," said he, when asked about how long he had been pursuing this line of work. "Our family has been doing it for decades; my father, grandfather and great grandfather before me. But we don't make the dolls. They come in from Kanchipuram, Cuddalore, Bunrutti, etc."

The other vendors gave us similar answers but were not more forthcoming. Sumathy (name changed), the last vendor we interviewed, was however, a goldmine of information about her business. What started out with a couple of questions from us turned into a lengthy conversation. We asked her the usual questions; about how long she had pursued that line of work (answer: "Since generations.") and where she got the dolls from (answer: "Bunrotti. Madurai, etc."). But we also ended up asking her more questions the answers for which were illuminating as well as entertaining. She enlightened us about the fact that the vendors didn't have to pay to set up shop during the festival, about the alternative jobs that most of the vendors did (driving autos, working in the textile industry, working as daily-wage labourers), about the making of the dolls and how they are carefully scrutinised by the customers before making a purchase. We also got one important question answered—when the trend of setting up shop in Mylapore started?

According to Sumathy, her ancestors had set up a small pavement shop containing a few dolls in North Mada Street to attract the temple-goers—the Kapaleeswar temple is quite famous in Mylapore, and is conveniently situated perpendicular to North Mada Street—and once they realised that it was potentially a good place to conduct sales, a bigger shop was opened. Consequently, other sellers followed, and a hundred years later, Mylapore is where you find the best dolls and are spoilt for choice.

Sumathy, when asked about the dolls that were well-liked among the customers, also informed us that each year different dolls were in demand. Apparently, the Vishnu and Shiva dolls are quite popular and a sure-sell, but the competition among the vendors, and their USP (Unique Selling Proposition) lies in the different dolls they manage to wangle each year. In Sumathy's shop, we saw dolls of Kumbakaran (from



the Ramayana) with cauldrons of food before him, a wedding scene, Ghatotgajan (from the Mahabharata), and so many others, and we realised that it was these new dolls representing stories from the epics that were attracting customers to her shop like moths to a flame; her shop seeming to be the most popular one in the whole street. But Sumathy's (and the other vendors') story is not all of joy and happiness.

Sumathy also told us about how most of the vendors she knew were not doing this job willingly, rather only for, as she called it, "vayithupozhappu" (livelihood). Selling these dolls was not very profitable this year too, what with the customers having to pay more due to new taxation norms.

While she was proud of the fact that her family was involved in selling these dolls for generations, those generations had also missed out on a good education and a steady income. Now all she wants is that her grandchildren should get a good education and secure good jobs.

The interviews with the vendors were enlightening and sobering because we came to know more about the dolls and the lives of those who sold them. We thank Sumathy and the other vendors for that informative session.

I think the most important lesson we learnt was that we are lucky to still see these bright and colourful dolls made by artisans and sellers who struggle to get them through to the customers and help keep the tradition and creativity that are embodied in a golu alive.






